2004 NATIONAL RALLY

On Thursday 09 October 2003 Carlisle was confirmed as one of the two venues for the prestigious national car rally - 'Roger Albert Clark Rally'.

Carlisle beat off competition from Gateshead to play host to two days of the four-day event which will take place on 20 – 24 November 2004.

The event aims to reproduce the style and feel of the old RAC Rally of Great Britain, which event organiser's claim was at its greatest in the 1970's and 1980's.

The event, staged over four days, will start in Sheffield before travelling to Carlisle and tour around the Lakes and South Scotland, before travelling back to Sheffield. Many of the traditional RAC stages will be used including Kielder Forest and Grizedale.

LOCAL DEMOCRACY WEEK

Monday 13 October 2003 was the start of this years' Local Democracy Week. We built on the success and popularity of last year's Young Mayor experiment and this year invited the primary schools to elect a Young Mayor and ten-year-old Yewdale School pupil, Alexandra Hayton was chosen as Carlisle's Young Mayor

In addition, we organised a Youth Executive, where two representatives from five secondary schools meet to discuss proposals to spend £2,000 of the Council's budget. Year 11,12 and 13 (15-18 year olds) students from Trinity, Caldew, St Aidan's, Austin Friars and William Howard took part. I chaired their first meeting in this Council Chamber on the first day of the Week. It was a lively debate and the 10 members of the Youth Executive will be meeting again in a few weeks to discuss schemes they'd like to spend the Council's money on.

LIFE EVENTS


Carlisle residents are able to get information and contact details, to help them through events they may have to face in their lives, all at a touch of a button.
