#### REQUEST FROM RESIDENTS TO CLOSE DOWN RYDAL STREET PLAY AREA

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A petition has been received from residents of the Rydal Street, South Street area of Botchergate East, requesting that the City Council address the problems being experienced by residents relating to the Rydal Street Play Area. A copy of the petition is included in this report.
- 1.2 The problems relate mainly to mis-use of the play area by teenagers, and not from the use of the play equipment by the children for whom it is provided.

#### 2.0 OPTIONS AVAILABLE TO THE CITY COUNCIL

- 2.1 The play area is very close to adjacent property, and it is accepted that teenagers mis-using the play area would cause considerable nuisance to residents living adjacent to the site.
- 2.2 The only way to remove the problem would be to close down the play area, and develop the land. Just removing the play equipment and leaving the empty space would not resolve the problems being experienced by residents.
- 2.3 Closure of the play area would mean the loss of play facilities for children living in the Botchergate East area.

#### 3.0 CONSULTATION

- 3.1 Whenever the City Council receives a request to close down a play area, the local community are consulted, due to the possible loss of a community facility. A questionnaire, a copy of which is included in this report, has been sent to all residents in the play area catchment area. The catchment area in this instance is considered to be the area enclosed by Rydal Street, Fusehill Street, Botchergate, and Brook Street.
- 3.2 The results of the questionnaire will not be available until 14<sup>th</sup> January, the closing date for responses. These results will therefore be reported to members at the Council meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> January.

#### 4.0 FUSEHILL STREET PLAY AREA

- 4.1 There are two playgrounds, Rydal Street and Fusehill Street, located within the defined catchment area. If it is decided to close the Rydal Street site, it is essential that the remaining playground at Fusehill Street is improved, with new equipment provided, to cater for the extra demand of more children using it.
- 4.2 There would be little point in closing the Rydal Street site unless it could be developed for housing. Some or all of the proceeds for the sale of the site to a developer would be used to provide new and additional equipment at Fusehill Street.

#### 5.0 CONCLUSION

- 5.1 There is no doubt that the proximity of the play area to surrounding property, and the anti-social behaviour of teenagers, is causing problems to residents. There is no point, however, in closing down the site without providing alternative play facilities and developing the site so that it does not remain a congregation point for teenagers.
- 5.2 There is an alternative site in the area at Fusehill Street, where new equipment could be provided, funded from the sale of the Rydal Street site if it were to be closed.
- 5.3 The results of the consultation exercise will have to be taken into account in coming to a decision on the future of the play area.

#### 6.0 RECOMMENDATION

- 6.1 It is recommended that, subject to a favourable response from the public consultation:-
  - A developer be sought to provide residential development on the site of Rydal Street Play Area.
  - (ii) The site be closed down, when a developer has bought the site.
  - (iii) Proceeds from the sale are used to provide additional play facilities on the Fusehill Street site, subject to local planning conditions relating to the siting of play equipment.

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## RYDAL STREET AND FUSEHILL STREET PLAYAREAS

This letter is being sent to all residents in the area bounded by Botchergate, Rydal St, Fusehill St & Brook St. It concerns playgrounds in your area (see plan overleaf).

Rydal St playarea has been the subject of complaints about nuisance and vandalism. The City Council has been asked to look into the possibility of closing the Rydal St playarea and using the site for new housing. If this goes ahead it might be possible to use some, or all, of the money raised from the sale of the site to provide extra equipment at the Fusehill St playarea. This improved playarea would then be the only playarea in the neighbourhood. Planning regulations would restrict the new equipment to a small area along the fence next to the Community Garden. The Rydal St playarea is in need of renovation. The remaining climber is due for removal soon, as it does not meet modern safety requirements. If the land at Rydal St is kept as a playarea it could be several years before equipment and surfacing is completely renewed. We are writing to ask what you think the Council should do.
