COMMUNICATIONS UNIT

The Communications Unit have been involved in P.R and promotional material for the Festival of Nations, Carlisle Carnival, Cumberland Weekend, Neighbourhood Dog Warden Scheme, Bitts Park Tennis Courts, Longtown Market Town Initiative, National Food Safety Week, Don't Choke Britain Campaign, Poop Scoop Week and National Bike Week.

There has also been involvement with launches and P.R for the new HMV Store, City Centre Bandstand and the LSP.

Publications produced have been the summer edition of the Focus Magazine and the LSP document.

The Internal Staff Newsletter is due to be distributed during the week commencing 15th July 2002.

Over 20 media students from the Cumbria Institute of the Arts have attended various Overview & Scrutiny Committee meetings.

There will be a Cumberland Weekend held in the City Centre from Saturday 20 July 2002 to Monday 22 July 2002, which will include a weekend of entertainment and traditional Cumbrian craft demonstrations. This will be followed by the arrival of the Commonwealth Games Queen's Jubilee Baton Relay.

A combination of multi-cultural music and local 'Razzamataz' will welcome the Commonwealth Games baton to Carlisle on Monday 22 July 2002.

A stage with live entertainment will welcome the Queens Jubilee Baton Relay after local runners have carried it from the outskirts to the City Centre. African drummers will take centre stage alongside the Carlisle 3

based 'Razzamataz Theatre School', and will culminate a daylong celebration of sport and street entertainment.

Carlisle has been chosen as only one of the 49 UK venues to play host to the Commonwealth Games Queens Jubilee Baton Relay and is set to be the last City to stage the Baton before arriving in Manchester for the opening ceremony on July 25 2002.

Brazilian football skills demonstrations, gymnastics displays and live music is planned from 10.00 a.m. until the Baton arrives in the City Centre at 6.55 p.m. A specially commissioned stage will be in place and BBC Radio Cumbria will compere the early evening entertainment.

4. ROYAL VISIT

As Members are aware Her Majesty the Queen will be visiting Carlisle on Monday 05 August 2002 accompanied by the Duke of Edinburgh.
