## HISTORY

Carlisle City Council granted Mr Wright a Private Hire Drivers Licence in 1989. Since that time he has held both Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licences. The Private Hire Drivers Licence was last renewed on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2001.

On 20<sup>th</sup> April 1998 Mr Wright appeared before the Licensing Panel as a result of motoring convictions and for not disclosing the latter of these convictions. His Private Hire driving licence was suspended for two weeks.

On 4<sup>th</sup> June 1998 Mr Wright appealed to Carlisle Magistrates Court against this decision. The appeal was rejected.

On 9<sup>th</sup> October 2001 Mr Wright was driving a Private Hire vehicle with a passenger on board in West Road, Wigton. He was stopped by the Police travelling at 47 mph in a 30 mph limit and was issued with a fixed penalty ticket (Appendix A). Under the conditions of his Private Hire driving licence he reported the offence to the Licensing Officer a few days later.

A copy of his DVLA licence is attached which shows a previous offence (Appendix B).

Section 61 (1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, states that a District Council may suspend or revoke a Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence on a number of grounds following conviction for an offence. Section 61 (1)(b) gives the ground of 'for any other reasonable cause' (Appendix C).

It is therefore recommended that members reach a decision in line with the options available after hearing the evidence.

#### **OPTIONS**

- To issue him with a letter of warning.
- To suspend his Private Hire drivers licence for a period of time.
- 3. To revoke his Private Hire drivers licence.

#### **PART II, 1976 ACT.**

#### SECTION 61.

#### SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF DRIVERS' LICENCES.

- (1) Notwithstanding anything in the Act of 1847 or in any part of this Act, a District Council may suspend or revoke or (on application therefore under Section 46 of the Act of 1847 or Section 51 of this Act, as the case may be) refuse to renew the licence of a driver of a Hackney Carriage or a Private Hire vehicle on any of the following grounds:-
  - (a) that he has since the grant of the licence:-
    - (i) been convicted of an offence involving dishonesty, indecency or violence: or
    - (ii) been convicted of an offence under or has failed to comply with the provisions of the Act of 1847 or of this part of this Act; or
  - (b) any other reasonable cause.
- (2) (a) Where a District Council suspend, revoke or refuse to renew any licence under this Section they shall give to the driver notice of the grounds on which the licence has been suspended or revoked or on which they have refused to renew such licence within fourteen days of such suspension, revocation or refusal and the driver shall on demand return to the District Council the driver's badge issued to him in accordance with Section 54 of this Act.
  - (b) If any person without reasonable excuse contravenes the provisions of this Section he shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Level 1 on the standard scale.
- (3) Any driver aggrieved by a decision of a District Council under this Section may Appeal to a Magistrates Court.
