## Summary:-

#### Introduction.

- 1.1 The City Council views leisure as a vehicle for the development of a vibrant city alongside the many other factors which are necessary to achieve this objective which are outlined in the Corporate Plan.
- 1.2 An important part of this theme was the establishment of a leisure Trust to operate the city's sports facilities. As part of this the council has agreed to invest £1.2 million over the next few years in the existing sports facilities in the city which are operated by Carlisle Leisure Limited.
- 1.3 Sports development is also seen as important in the development of opportunities for all sectors of our community wherever they reside in the City. Therefore a commitment to increase the money available for this function was made in the budget set by the Council for 2003/2004.

#### FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS.

- 2.1 The Council recognises that residents in Carlisle would like to see new leisure facilities opened and recent feedback from the public consultation exercise on the Council Budget for 2003/2004 showed that. A significant number of people responded positively to the question asked about the possibility of developing a new sports complex in the city.
- 2.2 A proposed feasibility study will be carried out, which will include public consultation, concerning the building of a new leisure complex in the city which could include a new pool, sports hall and ice rink.

### CONCLUSION.

3.1 Such a development would require substantial investment to build and operate and this will need to be considered as part of the consultation exercise undertaken with a range of interest groups. A development of this type would potentially have regional importance and the scope of the impact could be considerable on the area, therefore it is only right that prior to reaching any decision the Council is appraised of the necessary information, hence the need to carry out a feasibility study.
