Analysis of Pl's

The following table summarises performance indicators (PI's) reported for the first quarter of 2003/04 (1 April to 30 June 2003).

The analysis includes:

- · actual result for the first quarter
- · performance in relation to historical data (2001/02 and 2002/03 'actuals')
- · year-end projection based on current performance
- · comparison with target
- · comparison with benchmark (if applicable)
- · Details of PI showing portfolio name, corporate theme and business unit.

At this stage it is not possible to do a full analysis because the data set is incomplete (the system is in its infancy, there are new PI's, comparable data for previous quarters may not be available, and some data is inaccurate/incomplete etc).

However, an initial analysis was conducted on 49 PI's initially identified as suitable for quarterly reporting.

- Year-end estimates were extrapolated from the 1st quarter results (for example, sickness absence in the 1st quarter was multiplied by four to give a year-end estimate, 2.59 x 4 = 10.36). In some cases, year-end estimates were provided by Business Units.
- Year-end estimates were then compared with the targets to see if the targets would be met, at current performance (for example sickness year-end estimate = 10.36; target is 9.0. Therefore, at current performance levels, we would not meet the target).
- The results are summarised below.
