Summary:-

On 24th February 2009 the Licensing Sub Committee considered an application by Cumbria Police to review St Bede's Club Premises Licence. The decision of the sub committee was to suspend the premises licence for a period of three months and Mr Swailes was to be removed as Designated Premises Supervisor. The sub committee also added further conditions to the premises licence upon re-instatement. The committee of St Bede's Club appealed against the decision.

Following agreement between Cumbria Constabulary and the committee of St Bedes Club, the Magistrates Court remitted the matter back to the Licensing sub-committee to review its decision on the application of both parties.

Recommendation:-

It is recommended the Committee reconsiders the review application in accordance with one of the options set out in paragraph 7 of this report.

1 Review application Licensing sub-committee 24th February 2009

On 24th February 2009, a licensing subcommittee considered a review application in relation to St Bedes Club. After considering the evidence the committee made a resolution in accordance with the minutes **(Appendix 3)**.

2 The appeal at Carlisle Magistrates Court

St Bedes Club appealed against the decision of the licensing sub-committee. On 21st April 2009 the appeal hearing by St Bedes Club was listed at Carlisle Magistrates Court. The decision made was to remit the case to the licensing authority for reconsideration (Appendix 1).

Prior to the appeal hearing an agreement had been reached between the Police and St Bede's Club regarding the future running of the club. (Appendix 2).

3 <u>Developments Prior to the Appeal Hearing at Magistrates Court</u>

Following discussions between Mrs Hillary Holland (solicitor) representing St Bedes Social Club and Cumbria Police regarding the future running of the premises the following issues were agreed:

- Mr Swailes has now been replaced as Designated Premises Supervisor by Diane Spoore
- Miss Spoore has now taken over a lease of the property and Mr Swailes has no input whatsoever as to the running of the premises
- No alcohol shall be supplied after 1130pm on any day in any part of the premises.
- An area outside the patio doors leading into the car park may be set aside for the consumption of alcohol outside subject to the following conditions:-Only plastic glasses to be used in this area

A maximum of four tables can be provided in this area

There must be a suitable screen around this area at least six feet in height to prevent smokers and others congregating around the exterior of this area to minimise noise disruption.

This outside area is to be closed at 1700hrs every day and not used after that time.

Subject to the permitted use of this area no customers shall be permitted to take drinks in open canisters outside the premises.

The following conditions imposed by the Sub Committee on 24th February 09 remain unchanged:

At any time when a private function is being held at the club at least two SIA
accredited door supervisors will be employed at the premises both during the
function and when customers are leaving the club.

- The CCTV system shall be extended to cover the car park area and front entrance area.
- A designated smoking area shall be located in the South West corner of the car park, clearly marked and identified adjacent to the rear wall.
- The tables and chairs near to the entrance shall be removed.
- No customers shall be permitted to take drinks in open canisters outside the premises, including in the smoking area.
- Take full part in the Pubwatch scheme including being a full member with radio.

4. Minutes from Sub Committee Review Hearing 24.02.09

The Minutes from Licensing Sub Committee meeting regarding the application by Cumbria Police to review Premises Licence of St Bede's Club on 24.02.09 are attached to this report (Appendix 3). A notification of the Sub Committee's decision was forwarded to St Bedes Club (Appendix 4).

Diane Spoore is now the Designated Premises Supervisor for St Bede's Social Club.

6. PREMISES LICENCE

Premises: St Bedes Social Club, Silloth Street, Carlisle

Holder of Premises Licence

The Committee, St Bedes Social Club, Silloth Street Carlisle. They have been the holders of the Premises licence as well as a previous Club Premises Certificate since conversion under the Licensing Act 2003.

6.1 Current permitted hours

Sale by retail of alcohol On and Off the Premises.

Sunday - Saturday 10am - Midnight
 Boxing Day 10am - 2am
 New Years Day 10am - 2am

Regulated Entertainment including:

exhibition of a film (indoors); indoor sporting event, performance of live music; playing of recorded music; performance of dance; entertainment of a similar description to that falling within a performance of live music:

any playing of recorded music;

a performance of dance;

entertainment facilities for making music;

entertainment facilities for dancing;

entertainment of a similar description to that falling within entertainment facilities for making music or dancing.

6.3 Premises licence conditions attached to St Bedes

Licensing Act 2003 Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises the supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) the supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Mandatory Conditions where Door Supervisors are provided

Where a premises licence includes a condition that one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

The premises will still be run as a members club and all members are subject of club rules.

- 1. The Club will join the Pubwatch Scheme.
- 2. A tamper proof CCTV system shall be installed at the premises in liaison with and to the satisfaction of Cumbria Police. The images recorded by the system shall be retained in unedited form for a period of no less than 28days.
- 3. Two door supervisors (SIA) to work on Saturday evenings from 9pm.

- 4. Polycarbonate glasses to be used in the function room for private functions.
- 5. All external doors and windows to be closed when regulated entertainment takes place.

CCTV will be fitted no later than 27th April 2007 and conditions 1,3 & 4 to be reviewed following the issue of the licence.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

All members of the Club are subject to Club rules. Anyone found in breach could lose membership.

All crimes committed at the premises will be reported to the police.

Public Safety

All fire fighting equipment will be maintained, all signs displayed at all times.

All spillages will be cleaned immediately.

First Aid Kit will be on site and maintained.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

All doors and windows will be kept closed during Regulated Entertainment.

All members will be reminded regarding noise and litter issues and the effect on local residents.

The Protection of Children from Harm

No person under 18yrs will be allowed on the premises, unless accompanied by an adult. Staff will be made aware that if they are in doubt of a persons age then entrance will be refused.

- 7. The Licensing authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These steps are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence
 - (f) Issue an informal warning to the Licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular time

8. POLICY FRAMEWORK

- 8.1 It is a corporate objective to promote a healthy and safe Carlisle. The determination of an application to review a premises licence in accordance with the Act and its statement of licensing policy, fulfils that objective.
- 8.2 Paragraph 5.2.1 of the Carlisle City Council statement of licensing policy states 'The authority will view seriously applications for the review of any premises licence where it involves:
- Persistent failure to comply with licence conditions
- Actions or omissions by the licensee (or his staff) which undermine the licensing objectives, particularly where they endanger public safety, expose children to harm or cause public nuisance'.
- 8.3 Paragraph 5.2.2 goes onto say that the authority will also view particularly seriously, any applications for review where the police have frequently been called to attend incidents of disorder at the premises and there have been frequent sales of alcohol to under age, or persons already intoxicated.
- 8.4 Guidance is offered to licensing authorities under Section 182 of the Act, by the Secretary of State in relation to the review of premises licences. In particular, the guidance refers to the options available to the authority (see 1.6 of the report), paragraph 5.110 of the guidance states 'In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than a necessary and proportionate response. For example, licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual. Equally, it may emerge that poor management is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deeper problems which impact upon the licensing objectives'.
- 8.5 Paragraph 5.111 of the guidance relates to modification of the premises licence stating 'Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Accordingly temporary changes or suspension of the licence of the licence for up to three months may be imposed. This could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. Accordingly, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may

result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives in the circumstances that gave rise to the application for a review'.

9. THE LEGAL POSITION

- 9.1 The licensing authority must determine the application in accordance with Section 52 of the Act, which outlines the circumstances whereby a hearing is required and the options available to the committee when determining the application.
- 9.2 An appeal may be made to the magistrates' court against the decision of the authority by the responsible authority, interested party or premises licence holder, within 21 days from the date of being notified.
- 9.3 Section 52(11) provides that a determination under this section does not have effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

10. THE FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

11. RISK MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

11.1 By determining the application in accordance with the relevant sections of the Act, the statement of licensing policy and guidance offered by the secretary of state, the licensing authority is ensuring that the all of the licensing objectives are considered fully.

12. REASON FOR DECISION/RECOMMENDATION

- 12.1 Prior to the appeal hearing date an agreement had been reached between the Police and St Bede's Club regarding the future running of the club (Appendix 1)
- 12.2 The decision made at Carlisle Magistrates Court was to remit the case to the licensing authority to review its decision on the application of both parties.
- 12.3 The application will be determined in accordance with the relevant sections of the Act, the statement of licensing policy and guidance offered by the secretary of state

13. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Committee reconsiders the application in accordance with the options set out in paragraph 7 above.



On Tuesday 7TH April 2009 Insp. Quinn and Pc Minnion, Cumbria Police met with and Diane Spour the Designated Premises Supervisor for St Bedes Club Silloth Street and Hilary Holland Solicitor and Mr Fred Watson from the Licensing section.

The restrictions imposed at the Licensing hearing on 24th February 2009 were discussed to see if agreement could be reached without progressing to the appeal hearing. The restrictions imposed are shown below.

The premises will close for 3 months.

- · At any time when a private function is being held at the Club at least two SIA accredited doormen will be employed at the Premises both during the function and when customers are leaving the Club;
- The CCTV system shall be extended to cover the car park area and front entrance area;
- · A designated smoking area shall be located in the South West corner of the car park, clearly marked and identified adjacent to the rear wall;
- · The tables and chairs near to the entrance shall be removed:
- No customers shall be permitted to take drinks in open canisters outside the Premises, including in the smoking area:
- · Take full part in the pubwatch scheme including being a full member with radio;
- · No alcohol shall be supplied after 11pm on any day.

The following decisions were reached during this meeting

The police agreed that the club does not need to close for 3 months. The police acknowledge that a new management is running the premises and there appear to have been significant changes made under the new management, not least there has only been one incident where the police have been called since the hearing. The following are also agreed.



The following conditions remain unchanged

- At any time when a private function is being held at the Club at least two SIA accredited doormen will be employed at the Premises both during the function and when customers are leaving the Club;
- The CCTV system shall be extended to cover the car park area and front entrance area;
- A designated smoking area shall be located in the South West corner of the car park, clearly marked and identified adjacent to the rear wall;
- The tables and chairs near to the entrance shall be removed;
- Take full part in the pubwatch scheme including being a full member with radio;

The agreed changes are

• No alcohol shall be supplied after 11.30pm on any day in any part of the premises.

An area outside the patio doors leading into the car park may be set aside for the consumption of alcohol outside subject to the following conditions:- only plastic glasses are to be used in this area

a maximum of 4 tables can be provided in this area

there must be a suitable screen around this area at least 6 feet in height to prevent smokers and others congregating around the exterior of this area to minimise noise disruption

the outside area is to be closed at 1700 hours and not used after that time Subject to the permitted use of this area no customers shall be permitted to take drinks in open canisters outside the Premises

The arrangements for the festive period remain unchanged

All conditions prior to 24th February on the licence remain unchanged

LSC2.01/09 APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN FOR THE MEETING

RESOLVED – That Councillor Morton be appointed as Chairman of Licensing Sub-Committee 2 for this meeting. Councillor Morton thereupon took the Chair.

LSC2.02/09 APPLICATION TO REVIEW A PREMISES LICENCE BY CUMBRIA POLICE – ST BEDES SOCIAL CLUB, SILLOTH STREET, CARLISLE

The Licensing Officer submitted report LDS.22/09 regarding an application for the review of a premises licence in accordance with Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of premises known as St Bedes Social Club, Silloth Street, Carlisle.

In addition to the Council's Licensing Officers, Principal Solicitor and Trainee Committee Clerk, the following people attended the meeting to take part in proceedings:

Personal Licence Holder:

Hillary Holland, Cartmell Shepherd Solicitors Raymond Swailes, St Bedes Social Club Dianne Spoor, St Bedes Social Club

Applicant

Inspector Anthony Quinn, Cumbria Constabulary Sergeant Richard Higgin, Cumbria Constabulary PC Andrew Minnion, Cumbria Constabulary

The Principal Solicitor outlined the procedure for the meeting.

The Licensing Officer reported that an application had been received from Cumbria Constabulary under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003, for a review of the premises licence relating to St Bede's Social Club, Silloth Street, Carlisle.

The review application related to evidence of increased crime and disorder and Public Nuisance as well as concerns for residents' welfare and public safety.

Following the advertising of the review two further representations had been received from residents living in the immediate vicinity of the area.

The Club's solicitor, Mrs Holland, had forwarded letters of support from neighbours in Silloth Street as well as copies of notices and log sheets used within the premises. Mrs Holland had also requested that the Sub Committee consider some further letters of support that she had brought to the meeting. There being no objection from the Applicant, the Sub Committee agreed to take the letters into consideration.

The Licensing Officer then outlined the premises history which included an application to extend the hours of licensable activities which had been considered and refused by the Licensing Sub Committee in 2007.

The Licensing Officer reported the relevant sections of the Council's Licensing Policy Framework which had a bearing on the application and should be taken into consideration when making a decision. He also outlined the relevant National Guidance and reminded Members that the application must be considered, with regard given to the representations made and the evidence given before them.

Inspector Quinn, on behalf of the applicant, then addressed the Sub-Committee. Inspector Quinn asked the Sub Committee if a DVD could be played, the DVD showed an interview with Mr Swailes which had taken place during an unannounced licensed premises check on 8 November 2008.

The Sub Committee and Mrs Holland had no objections to the DVD being played. All parties viewed the DVD recording in its entirety. The recoding showed that Mr Swailes had not complied with four condition as follows:

- CCTV was in use but there was only seven days worth of footage available and not 28 days as required
- There were no door supervisors on duty and the door supervisor who had previously been in post had not been SIA accredited
- Polycarbonate glasses were not in use
- An external door was open while the regulated entertainment was taking place

Inspector Quinn then highlighted the following:

- There had been concerns regarding disorder in Silloth Street and as result the Premises Licence had additional conditions added to it in April 2007;
- There had been problems with violent crime and public disorder;
- In 2008 a number of residents complained about noise, disorder, broken glasses and litter;

- The Police logs for the Premises which had been submitted to the Sub Committee showed violent crimes, litter, drug use and underage drinking;
- Local Officers had received complaints and as a result two officers conducted an unannounced licensed premises check at St Bedes Club on 8 November 2008. The premises check showed that Mr Swailes had not been complying with all of the conditions that had been added to his licence in April 2007.
- Police had made a further visit to the premises on 11 January 2009 and there had again been no door supervisors on duty;
- The Police wanted the Premises Licence to be revoked
- Although the Police believed that Mr Swailes should be removed as the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS), there was some concern that because Mr Swailes owned the premises he would influence any future DPS:
- The Police submitted a list of additional conditions, that they felt should be added to the Premises Licence if the Sub Committee was not minded to revoke it, for consideration by the Sub Committee

The DVD had showed that Mr Swailes had believed that the conditions that had been attached to his Licence in April 2007 were only for a period of 6 months and after that time he did not have to follow the conditions. The Chairman asked the Licensing Officer to clarify the situation.

The Licensing Officer stated that the conditions had been voluntary as a result of discussions between Mr Swailes, the Police and local residents. The conditions were attached to the Premises Licence and it had been agreed that they would be reviewed after six months by the Police. If the Police agreed to the conditions being removed Mr Swailes would have to apply for a variation to the premises licence to have them removed. Mr Swailes had not made such an application and, in fact, the Police had carried out a review and decided that the conditions should remain.

In response to a Member's question Inspector Quinn stated that it was understood that there would be an application made for a new DPS at the premises who may be a current member of staff, Police were unsure of Mr Swailes influence over the prospective DPS.

In response to a further question Mrs Holland stated that although Mr Swailes owned the premises and was the DPS, it was St Bedes Social Club and there was a Committee responsible for the premises. Mr Swailes was on the Committee but intended to retire from it.

Mrs Holland, on behalf of St Bede's Social Club, then addressed the Sub-Committee highlighting the following:

 Mr Swailes had not complied with all of the additional conditions but he had genuinely misunderstood the conditions and believed that they were only a requirement for six months;

- There was CCTV in the premises and footage was available as far back as October. Mr Swailes had been unable to work the CCTV properly at the time of the licensed premises check but now understood how to operate the system;
- The Police had not issued any warnings or prosecuted Mr Swailes over the conditions;
- Mr Swailes had left a message with the Police to check if the conditions were only for six months because he was confident they had been removed but they had not returned his call and he had not followed the call up;
- Mr Swailes realised that the conditions had not been changed when the application for review was made and at that point he quickly took steps to comply with the conditions. There was now an accredited SIA door supervisor on duty every Saturday and for every function, the CCTV was working properly and polycarbonate glasses were in use;
- The Police had produced a comparison table of visits to other social club premises but, whereas some of the comparator clubs held only a Club Premises Certificate, St Bedes Social Club held a premises licence, which allowed members of the members to go into the premises. It was felt that the comparison should have been made with other public house premises instead:
- The written complaints from residents appeared to be the result of Police visiting residents;
- Mr Swailes had received written letters of support as a result of a newspaper article regarding the Sub Committee meeting;
- The DVD showed that there was noise inside the premises but when officers left the premises there was no noise discernable;
- The premises provided a good facility for the local community which included a venue for the residents association, a football team and bingo;
- Mr Swailes believed he had a good relationship with the Police and hoped that would continue in the future;
- Mr Swailes bought the premises four years ago and residents did highlight that the premises had become busier. This was because Mr Swailes needed to run a profitable business and he had therefore developed the functions trade which had allowed the premises to grow;
- Mr Swailes had carried out a full management review of the premises which included:
 - hiring Ms Spoor to manage the premises
 - hiring two accredited SIA door supervisors to work on Saturdays and during functions
 - creation of a record of door supervisors start and finish times
 - creation of an incident and refusal register
 - written door supervisor policy
 - proposed inst allation of male toilets in the function room to prevent guests going through the bar
 - Separate access to a smoking area for the function room

- Guests in the function room were not allowed to take glasses outside and non smokers would not be allowed to congregate outside in the smoking area
- Smokers would not be allowed outside after 11.30pm
- The door that had been opened whilst the Police were in the premises would have a sign placed next to it asking patrons to close the door behind them and a closing mechanism could be considered;
- When there was an 18th birthday party a £200 deposit was taken, all guests had to produce proof of age and guests were searched to prevent them bringing their own drink onto the premises;
- All guests were asked to stay inside the foyer of the premises whilst they were waiting for taxis
- Ms Spoor would take a lease of the premises from Mr Swailes for 2 years and would take over the full running of the premises and wanted to show both the Committee and the Police that the review of the premises licence had been taken very seriously

Ms Spoor addressed the sub committee and stated that she had been the bar manager at the premises since January and had introduced a lot of changes which included no longer hosting 18th birthday parties, although the two bookings for the next month would be honoured. She stated that she had been in the pub trade for 15 years and had 11 years experience as a manager. She had her own pub in Dearham for two years and had previously worked for Wetherspoons. She intended to introduce a food business at the Premises and commented that the functions she had run since her employment at the Club had gone well.

Mrs Holland then answered questions and responded to comments from Sub-Committee Members in relation to the following:

- Although Mr Swailes had understood that the conditions had been removed after six months he kept a door supervisor as he felt it was good practice to have one;
- The premises licence allowed for members of the public to use the function room which held approximately 150;
- The majority of complaints were made when functions were on;
- The concerns of residents had been taken very seriously but there had also been a lot of letters in support of the premises from residents;
- When Ms Spoor took over the lease the business would be hers and Mr Swailes would not be involved in the business
- The Police logs had been taken very seriously. In the past there had been no proper control over people entering and leaving the premises and this would change with the new management of the premises and Police co-operation would be fundamental to this
- Mr Swailes was naive to have believed that the conditions had been removed after six months but as soon as he found out he had been wrong he immediately took steps to put everything in place. He had contacted the Police but made a mistake by not chasing the matter up.

Inspector Quinn clarified that Mr Swailes had left a message for Sergeant Higgin and Sergeant Higgin had contact Mr Swailes and told him in no uncertain terms that the conditions were still valid. He also commented that he did not see how the proposed management changes would affect the levels of nuisance and disorder.

Mrs Holland responded that with good management such incidents should be rare.

At 3.25pm, all parties, with the exception of the Sub-Committee Members, the Principal Solicitor and the Trainee Committee Clerk withdrew from the meeting whilst the Sub-Committee gave detailed consideration to the matter.

The parties returned at 4.05pm to hear the Sub-Committee's decision which was as follows:-

This matter concerned an application by Cumbria Constabulary to review the Premises Licence at St Bede's Social Club, Silloth Street, Carlisle.

The sub committee has considered the application and taken into account the evidence before it. In particular it has listened to the submissions made by:

- 1. Inspector Quinn on behalf of Cumbria Constabulary
- 2. Hillary Holland on behalf of St Bedes Social Club
- 3. Diane Spoor

The Sub Committee has also considered written evidence in the form of statements from police officers and local residents and character references provided on behalf of Raymond Swailes and has taken account of this evidence.

After careful consideration the Sub Committee has unanimously decided to suspend the Premises Licence and remove Raymond Lee Swailes as designated premises supervisor and gives the following reasons:

- 1. The Sub Committee has had regard to the Licensing Policy, in particular paragraphs 5.2.1 and 5.2.2, as well as the s182 Guidance. It takes seriously any actions or omissions by the Licensee or its staff which undermine the licensing objectives. - 5. Members of the Sub Committee consider that the cause of this problem is the ineffective management and lack of control of the Premises Licence Holder, Mr Swailes. It considered that it had no option but to remove Mr Swailes as Designated Premises Supervisor. The Sub Committee considered whether alternative measures short of revocation could be applied and decided that a period of suspension would both deter the licence holder from allowing the problems to happen again and would also enable Diane Spoor to make an application to be Designated Premises Supervisor and put in place the changes to the management regime and structural changes which were outlined at the hearing. In view of the seriousness of the nuisance and disorder and the breaches of conditions the Sub Committee felt that a period of three months would be appropriate.
- 6. Accordingly, the Premises Licence is suspended for three months and Mr Swailes is removed as Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 7. Furthermore, the Sub Committee considered that, upon resumption of the Licence, the following conditions will be applied in addition to those existing conditions:
 - At any time when a private function is being held at the Club at least two SIA accredited doormen will be employed at the Premises both during the function and when customers are leaving the Club;
 - The CCTV system shall be extended to cover the car park area and front entrance area;
 - A designated smoking area shall be located in the South West corner of the car park, clearly marked and identified adjacent to the rear wall;
 - The tables and chairs near to the entrance shall be removed;
 - No customers shall be permitted to take drinks in open canisters outside the Premises, including in the smoking area;
 - Take full part in the pubwatch scheme including being a full member with radio;
 - No alcohol shall be supplied after 11pm on any day.
- 8. The suggested condition of a six month review is not appropriate but it is open to either party to make any application they feel appropriate in due course.

The decision would be confirmed in writing and would include details of the right of appeal.

The Chairman added that the Sub Committee's initial instinct, after listening to the representations and reading the report, had been to revoke the licence but they had reconsidered after taking into account the future of the club with the new management regime in place.

1 THE APPLICATION (Appendix A)

1.1 Applicant

Cumbria Constabulary

In accordance with Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 an application has been received from Cumbria Constabulary, for the review of the premises licence relating to St Bedes Social Club, Silloth Street, Carlisle.

1.2 Grounds for review

The Police have stated that the grounds for the review are: Evidence of increased crime and disorder, the prevention of a public nuisance as well as concerns for residents welfare. They have provided additional information to amplify this (appendix B 1-30)

- 1.3 The application has been copied and forwarded to the Premises Licence Holder as well as all Responsible Authorities. Further additional details supporting the application have also been forwarded.
- 1.4 The application has been advertised on the premises, at the Council offices and the Council website as required by statute for a 28 day period.
- 1.5 Three further representations have been received from residents living in the immediate vicinity of the premises(appendix C 1-3)
- 1.6 Mrs Hillary Holland from Cartmell Shepherd Solicitors represents St Bedes Club and has forwarded a letter of support from neighbours in Silloth Street as well as copies of notices and log sheets used within the premises (appendix D 1-2). A Dianne Spoor will also be in attendance speaking on behalf of St Bedes club.
- 1.7 The Licensing authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These steps are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence
 - (f) Issue an informal warning to the Licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular time

2 PREMISES LICENCE

Premises: St Bedes Social Club, Silloth Street, Carlisle. (Area Plan & premises plan Appendix E 1-2)

2.1 Holder of Premises Licence

The Committee, St Bedes Social Club, Silloth Street Carlisle. They have been the holders of the Premises licence as well as a previous Club Premises Certificate since conversion under the Licensing Act 2003.

2.4 Premises licence conditions attached to St Bedes

Licensing Act 2003 Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises the supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (c) The supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a
- (d) person who holds a personal licence

Mandatory Conditions where Door Supervisors are provided

Where a premises licence includes a condition that one ore more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

General

The premises will still be run as a members club and all members are subject of club rules.

- 1. The Club will join the Pubwatch Scheme.
- 2. A tamper proof CCTV system shall be installed at the premises in liaison with and to the satisfaction of Cumbria Police. The images recorded by the system shall be retained in unedited form for a period of no less than 28days.
- 3 Two door supervisors (SIA) to work on Saturday evenings from 9pm.
- 4 Polycarbonate glasses to be used in the function room for private functions.
- 5 All external doors and windows to be closed when regulated entertainment takes place.

CCTV will be fitted no later than 27th April 2007 and conditions 1,3 & 4 to be reviewed following the issue of the licence.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

All members of the Club are subject to Club rules. Anyone found in breach could lose membership.

All crimes committed at the premises will be reported to the police.

Public Safety

All fire fighting equipment will be maintained, all signs displayed at all times.

All spillages will be cleaned immediately.

First Aid Kit will be on site and maintained.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

All doors and windows will be kept closed during Regulated Entertainment.

All members will be reminded regarding noise and litter issues and the effect on local residents.

The Protection of Children from Harm

No person under 18yrs will be allowed on the premises, unless accompanied by an adult. Staff will be made aware that if they are in doubt of a persons age then entrance will be refused.

3 PREMISES HISTORY

- 5th Aug 05 Conversion of Club Registration Certificate to Club Premises Certificate under Licensing Act 2003.
- 11th Jul 06 Caution letter forwarded from Licensing Office to Mr Swailes regarding complaints of noise by residents and unlicensed activities taking place at the premises. Mr Swailes had previously attended a meeting at the Civic Centre with the Licensing manager prior to the warning letter.
- 4th Dec 06 Variation application for Club Premises Certificate to extend the hours of licensable activities. Representations were made by residents and police.
- 5th Feb 07 Variation application to extend the hours of licensable activities Determined by a Licensing Sub Committee when the application was refused.
- 26th Feb 07 Mr Swailes appeared before Carlisle Magistrates Court for carrying out unlicensed activities during November and December 2006. He was fined £700.
- 1st Mar 07 New application submitted for a Premises Licence by Mr Swailes. Two representations were made by residents as well as the police. Following consultation between Mr Swailes and the objectors he then volunteered further conditions to be added to the application, As a result the objections were withdrawn.
- 5th Apr 07 New Premises Licence issued.
- 12th Jan 09 Application from police to review Premises Licence.

4 POLICY FRAMEWORK

- 4.1 It is a corporate objective to promote a healthy and safe Carlisle. The determination of an application to review a premises licence in accordance with the Act and its statement of licensing policy, fulfils that objective.
- 4.2 Paragraph 5.2.1 of the Carlisle City Council statement of licensing policy states 'The authority will view seriously applications for the review of any premises licence where it involves:
 - Persistent failure to comply with licence conditions
 - Actions or omissions by the licensee (or his staff) which undermine the licensing objectives, particularly where they endanger public safety, expose children to harm or cause public nuisance'.
- 4.3 Paragraph 5.2.2 goes onto say that the authority will also view particularly seriously, any applications for review where the police have frequently been called to attend incidents of disorder at the premises and there have been frequent sales of alcohol to under age, or persons already intoxicated.
- Guidance is offered to licensing authorities under Section 182 of the Act, by the Secretary of State in relation to the review of premises licences. In particular, the guidance refers to the options available to the authority (see 1.7 of this report), paragraph 11.18 of the guidance states 'In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than a necessary and proportionate response. For example, licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual. Equally, it may emerge that poor management is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deeper problems which impact upon the licensing objectives'.
- 4.5 Paragraph 11.21 of the guidance relates to modification of the premises licence stating 'Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Accordingly temporary changes or suspension of the licence of the licence for up to three months may be imposed. This could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. Accordingly, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives

in the circumstances that gave rise to the application for a review'.

5 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The licensing authority must determine the application in accordance with Section 52 of the Act, which outlines the circumstances whereby a hearing is required and the options available to the committee when determining the application.
- 5.2 An appeal may be made to the magistrates' court against the decision of the authority by the responsible authority, interested party or premises licence holder, within 21 days from the date of being notified.
- 5.3 Section 52(11) provides that a determination under this section does not have effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

- 8.2 The application will be determined in accordance with the relevant sections of the Act, the statement of licensing policy and guidance offered by the secretary of state

On the 05/04/2007 St Bedes social club, Silloth Street, Carlisle was provided with a license to operate as a licensed premises following the designated premises supervisor Mr Raymond lee SWAILES being convicted of serving alcohol after permitted hours. As a result of consultation with the licensing board, Police and local residents SWAILES was granted a license with strict conditions attached to it. These additional conditions were:

- 1) To become a member of pub watch and adhere to the pub watch conditions.
- 2) To install a CCTV system to the satisfaction of Cumbria police. The images on the system to be retained in an unedited format for a period of not less than 28 days.
- 3) Two door supervisors (SIA) to work on Saturday evenings from 2100 hours.
- 4) Polycarbonate glasses to be used in function room for private functions.
- 5) All external doors and windows to be closed when regulated entertainment takes place

CCTV to be fitted no later than 27th April 2007 and conditions 1, 3, 4, to be reviewed 6 moths following license issue.

Sergeant Higgin PS 321 as part of his role acts as a licensing officer for Cumbria Police. When the six month review of SWAILES license was due Srg Higgins liaised with PS 714 Kelly (Carlisle city West community LPT Srg) and it was agreed that conditions 2,3,4 should remain, this decision was passed to the council licensing dept by PS 321 Higgin.

In response to concerns from members of the public and residents of Silloth Street on Saturday the 08/11/08 PC's 1735 MINNION and 1552 HARDING conducted an unannounced licensed premises check at St Bedes Social club, Silloth Street, Carlisle. The visit commenced at 2145 hours. The whole visit was captured on head cam worn overtly by PC 1735 MINNION

The findings are summarised as follows:

Non compliance of point 2 of the license (CCTV) - A check of the CCTV system was made and it was ascertained that the system was only recording images for 7 days in an unedited format not the 28 days as required. The system only had two cameras attached to it one at the front door and one in the function room both these cameras could have been adjusted easily to provide much improved images of persons in he club. SWAILES had a very dismissive attitude towards his CCTV system stating

"No, well I think when I put it in it was like 28 days, do you know what I mean, to be honest with you I never look at it do you know what I mean, its there well like a lot of things its there until something happens and then you've got to go and fucking look at it, do you know what I mean"

The system had the capability to run an additional two cameras but claimed that being in the pub trade was difficult and implied finances were the obstacle in fitting more cameras.

Non compliance of point 3 of the license (Door supervisors) - At the time of the check it would be expected two SIA accredited door supervisors would be on duty at the club. None were working. SWAILES explanation being;

"He's not turned up tonight well to be honest I've sacked him, I sacked him last week because he was stood behind the bar and helping himself to drink"

SWAILES continued "He was a lad called Phil, he wasn't what do you call it a SIA doorman, but I don't have to have SIA doormen anymore"

Not only was SWAILES breaching his license but he demonstrated a total lack of understanding concerning the employment of door staff who by law must be SIA accredited, for SWAILES to be so ignorant on this matter is alarming.

Non compliance of point 4 of the licence (Polycarbonate glasses) - At the time of the check it would be expected

SWAILES would be using polycarbonate glasses in his function room, this however was not the case, no polycarbonate glasses were in use.

SWAILES explanation being;

"The only thing I haven't stuck by is the glasses because the glasses is something I totally fucking disputed from the start, how can I serve my customers drink in fucking plastic glasses were a fucking social club do you know what I mean , anyway I didn't have a choice I had to stick to it so I done it, I've still got them there, so after the six month I just used normal glasses that's the only thing I've done, and the doorman I sacked him last week"

Raymond added;

"Wait there look these are the plastic glasses that's the only thing I've given up, alright you've caught us out tonight I haven't got a doorman on but if you'd come a week ago"

Non compliance of point 5 (closure of external doors) At time of the visit it would be expected that all
external doors and windows would be closed, this however
was not the case an external door at the rear of the
premises was found to be stood wide open, with loud music
being played inside the club, SWAILES explanation being;
"That's someone probably gone outside for a fag for fucks
sake give us half a chance"

Again this breach demonstrated poor management of the issues surrounding the club by SWAILES that he allows smokers to stand outside with external doors open when he has provided a suitable place for smokers outside which does not require external doors to be left open when used.

Throughout the licensed premises check SWAILES maintained that points 2, 3, and 4 were not applicable to his license anymore as they had been reviewed in October 2007 and now did not form part of his license. SWAILES could not provide any evidence of the review revoking points 2, 3, and 4 of his license he stated;

"That's something I might have had E-mailed to me but that's such a long time ago I've probably deleted it. I might not have paperwork to back it up but I would think if you spoke to Fred Watson he would think the same as what I think. I would think Srg Higgin would remember the conversation as well. Maybe what has happened is that after the six months these conditions haven't been lifted off, I was under the impression that if things went well if we had no incidents which we didn't then I would be free of the conditions"

Srg Higgin was involved in the review of SWAILES license and at the six month review concluded that points 2, 3, and 4 should remain, this information was passed onto the council licensing panel.

Given the circumstances as described SWAILES was found to be in breach of points 2, 3, 4, and 5 of his license on

the 08/11/08 between 2145 hours and 2210 hours at Silloth Street social club, Carlisle

On Saturday 11/01/09 Silloth Street social club was again visited by police PC 1846 Boustead and PC 1959 Kay attended at 2251 hours and again found there were no door staff present at the club. PC Boustead spoke to the licensee Mr Raymond SWAILES who stated "DUSTY SAID I DON'T NEED DOORSTAFF ON" (SWAILES refers to PS 321 HIGGIN as DUSTY. Since the initial check on the premises on the 08/11/08 SWAILES has contacted Carlisle City council licensing dept to clarify his license conditions. SWAILES had been advised that conditions 2,3,4, and 5 are still applicable and should be adhered to.

No further checks of SWAILES licence conditions were checked on the 11/01/09.

Since the imposition of a strict license to curtail incidents of public nuisance, crime and disorder the police have received continual complaints and had to attend various incidents of disorder at the club. Mr SWAILES has failed to improve the situation at the club and cannot be seen to be taking reasonable steps to resolve the issues.

Local residents many of whom are elderly have complained to PC 1735 MINNION the local community officer regarding the issues of noise and disorder emanating from the club. Local residents believe that the noise and disorder is coming from St Bede's club rather than the Ukrainian Club which is situated on the same street. Much of the residents concerns are for noise and disorder after midnight the Ukrainian clubs opening hours being:

Mon-Fri 1900-2300

Sat 1200-1500, 1900-2330

Sun 1130-2300

During functions the club occasional operates until midnight with the bar closing at 2345 and the club being empty and closed at midnight.

To date (25/11/08) since the provision of a strict license to Mr SWAILES on the 05/04/2007, Cumbria police have received 15 calls for service to attend the club. These calls vary from reported assaults including 1 reported GBH, Class A drug dealing (cocaine), 11 reported incidents of anti social behaviour including reported disorder on the street which emanated from the club and required a police officer to use PAVA spray against an offender due to high level of aggression the offender displayed, reported noise complaints and under age drinking occurring in the club.

Attached to file a complete record of the 15 incidents described below;

463-b-100407, report of assault GBH occurring inside club

398-b-270507, PC 1552 Harding detained male inside club in Possession of Class A drug Cocaine, in circumstances consistent with drug dealing/supply.

351-b-05/08/08, report of loud music blaring out of the club at 1659 hours in the afternoon.

11-b-06/08/2008, report of assault ABH occurring inside club.

480-b-17/11/08, report of 2 males and 2 females fighting on the street outside club at 2240 hours at night.

328-b-26/12/07, report of a big fight going on the West end club, Carlisle. Upon police arrival the violence had stopped but large numbers of people were shouting and swearing in a disorderly manner, it was during this incident one male had to be PAVA'ed by a police officer due to the level of aggression displayed by the male. This incident occurred at 2235 hours.

591-b-140308, report of elderly resident of Silloth Street in her 70's being extremely shaken and distressed by drunken patrons of the club banging on her door at 2318 hours at night.

460-B-190408, report of assault occurring inside the club disorder was two females having a drunken verbal altercation inside the club.

137-b-270908, report from local resident of Silloth Street regarding broken alcohol bottles and glasses strewn on the road outside the club at 0845 hours following a large party at the club the previous evening.

10-b-270908, report from local resident of Silloth Street at 0012 hours describing people milling about drunk outside the club and the noise from the club being described as awful.

509-b-260908, report from another local resident of Silloth Street complaining of noise and drunks outside in the yard/car park of the club at 2332 hours.

453-b-260908, report of 80 persons outside the club drinking, smashing bottles and swearing at 2154 hours.

249-b-161108, report of a drunken male having been ejected from the club and acting in a disorderly fashion outside on the street at 1343 hours.

391-b-151008, report of noise disturbance at club, people drinking outside on street, under age drinking, bottles being smashed on the street and people vomiting on the street at 2205 hours. Engs reveal this to be a Trinity school 6th form party with the likelihood numerous people at the club would be underage aged 16-17.

All the above incidents have occurred whilst Mr SWAILES is the designated premises supervisor and since the imposition of a strict and robust license at the club. The strict license coupled with fit and proper management should mean incidents as described above are a rare occurrence not a regular occurrence.

Residents of Silloth Street have been spoken to by the local community police officer PC 1735 MINNION. A number of community impact statements have been recorded and are attached to the file.

Residents of the street report serious problems associated with the club in summary these issues are; Noise (music/taxis)

Broken smashed glasses/bottles on the street Vomit/urine on the street

Fighting and disorderly behaviour on the street Increased numbers of people drinking and smoking in the car park

Damage occurring to resident's property Underage drinking Large parties

Drug taking

Residents have reported fighting occurring outside the club mainly on Friday and Saturday nights this includes the use of weapons.

Residents are having to on a regular basis clean up vomit/urine from there doorsteps and pavement the morning after the club has been open, one resident reports having to dispose of a used condom discarded outside her house. A common concern of residents is the amount of broken glass found on the street in the mornings this has obvious health and safety issues and one resident has had 3-4 punctures caused by broken glass to her car tyres. On evenings when SWAILES has had a large function in the club at closing time large numbers of drunken persons converge on he street and this causes the residents some

Cumbria constabulary have previously made representations relating to this premises. These representations were made following Police entering the club on the 2nd December 2006 following reports of breaches of the licensing act 2003.

Clear evidence was found that offences were being committed and on the 7th December 2006 Mr Raymond SWAILES attended the Carlisle Police station and was interviewed in relation to licensing offences. SWAILES was reported for summons for licensing offences and was subsequently fined at Carlisle magistrate's court for the breaches.

On the 18th December 2006 Police Srg Richard Higgin of Cumbria constabulary registered an objection to the application made by Mr SWAILES for a variation on the St Bedes Social club, Club certificate. The grounds for objection being that an extension of the opening hours and introduction of regulated entertainment would create further noise and disorder and thereby cause a public nuisance, crime and disorder.

As a result of the above police action and intervention on the 05/04/07 SWAILES was provided with a license in respect of the St Bedes social club. The conditions of this license being such that public nuisance, crime and disorder would be minimised.

This however has not succeeded and problems are still occurring, this coupled with SWAILE'S poor management and breaches of the license mean further representations need to be made in the form of a license review.

I write on behalf of Cumbria Constabulary to register our objection to the application, made by Mr Swailes, for a variation on the St Bedes Social Club, Club Certificate.

The grounds for the objection are that an extension of the opening hours and the introduction of regulated entertainment would create further noise and disorder and thereby cause a Public Nuisance, Crime and Disorder.

The grounds for the objection are supported by the fact that Police have received continual complaints and have had to attend various incidents of disorder at St Bedes Club. The incidents that have been reported to the police and have required police to attend the premises for the period 01/01/06 to date and have been recorded on Police incident logs are as follows:

- 28/01/06 23:39hrsMember of Staff at Silloth Street Club reporting "Fight in big room".
- 12/03/06 19:50hrs Local resident reporting a fight outside the Club approx 10 adults.
- 01/05/06 22:15hrs Mr Swailes reporting 3 people fighting using chairs and pool cues.
- 07/05/06 21:27hrs Local resident reporting fight in the yard at club man lying on floor
- 25/06/06 02:20hrs Local resident reporting loud music coming from club.
- 27/08/06 19:51hrs Call from bar staff for assistance to eject persons barred from the club.
- 03/09/06 00:25hrs report of large fight in the car park
- 30/09/06 23:29hrs Resident reporting disturbance at Silloth Street Club.
- 01/10/06 00:10hrs Report of 6-8 persons arguing in Silloth st.
- 26/11/06 00:16hrs club singer requesting ambulance for male who has been assaulted.

Furthermore at 23:54hrs on Saturday 2nd December 2006 Police officers entered the St Bedes Club following reports of breaches of the Licensing Act 2003. There was clear evidence that offences were being committed.

Alcohol was being served from the bar after 23:00hrs otherwise than authorised by the Club Certificate.

The club has been holding regulated entertainment at the premises, on a frequent basis, when not authorised to do so.

On 7Th December 2006 The Certificate holder, Mr Swailes attended the Police Station and was interviewed for these offences and has been reported for Summons.

PC 1306 O'Dowd, The local community officer has received letters of complaint, from local residents; regarding disorder emanating from the club He has also received complaints from residents via the local Councillor.

The St Bedes Social Club is located in a residential area of which a number of residents are elderly.

On Saturday 8 th November 2008 I was in full uniform wearing a headcam working in company with
PC 1552 HARDING when at 2145 hours we attended SILLOTH STREET SOCIAL CLUB, SILLOTH
STREET, CARLISLE to conduct a licensed premises check at the location. I recorded the entire visit
on my headcam and can produce a master DVD of the visit as exhibit ASM/01.
Upon entering the club via the front and main door there were approximatley 5 persons stood
outside the front door of the club smoking, non of these persons were displaying an SIA door
supervisors badge and at the front door there was no sign of any door supervisors.
I entered the club and was met by the designated premises supervisor. Mr Raymond Lee SWAILES
in the bar of the premises. SWAILES lead us to a corridor between the bar and the function room so
we could speak. I stood and spoke with SWAILES at the top of a set of stairs next to an external
door which was stood wide open.
During the licensed premises check I found SWAILES to be in breach of the following conditions.
1) His CCTV system in the club observed by myself on the 11/08/2008 did not retain images in
unedited format for 28 days, by SWAILES own admission his CCTV system was storing images for
only 7 days.

- 4) SWAILES had an open external door at his club on Saturday 08/11/08 whilst music and entertainment were ongoing inside the club.

During my conversation with SWAILES he admitted to operating his club as described above but claimed this did not constitute a breach of license as he believed the conditions described above had expired from his license in October 2007. I myself witnessed all the above breaches except number 3. During the premises check I did not enter the fuction room.

Bedes Social club also known as Silloth street social club on Silloth street, Carlisle.					
I am aware the owner of the club is man called Raymond Swailes. Swailes has owned and ran the					
club for approximatley 2-3 years I cannot be sure when he took over the club. Since Swailes took					
over the club a whole host of problems have emerged on Silloth street all associated with the social					
club. I have been a resident of Silloth street for in excess of 50 years and I have never known it be					
so bad in the area since Swailes bought the social club.					
Immediatley since Raymond Swailes began to run the club I began to suffer from problems outside					
my house. Vomit and urine on the pavement up against my door and generally vomit and urine on					
the street near to the entrance of the club. My wooden gate has also been damaged as two males					
were fighting in the street and fell through the gate.					
When there has been a private function in the club and on normal nights I have often found broken					
beer bottles, broken glasses and discarded food in my rear garden. These items have been thrown					
over my garden wall from the club and could easily of caused me serious injury if they struck me.					
In the first year of Raymond owning the club this is the kind of behaviour I used to be faced with on					
a regular basis, on a Friday/Saturday night it was always much worse.					
After owning the club for about one year Raymond was proscuted for serving alcohol after hours.					
Following this myself and other residents became involved in the consultation process with regards					
to Swailes licence. We all objected to Swailes being given a license but ultimatley in April 2007 he

Sonce April 2007 things improved for only a few weeks then the old problems came to a head again.

In June/July 2007 the smoking ban was introduced and Swailes put a number of tables in his car park for his customers to use. The conserquence of this is that large numbers of people gather in the car park of the club, on a Friday and Saturday night there can be upwards of 30-40 peoaple in the carpark all smoking and drinking. They drink outside out of glass containers which often get smashed causing a terrible mess on the street and aslo causing a lot of noise late at night.

Another problem is when the club closes, often large numbers of people gather at the entrance of the car park on Silloth Street waiting for taxis, these persons bring with them drinks from the club and when the taxi arrives they throw the bottles and glasses on the floor creating mess and loud noise.

The large numbers of people also urinate and vomit on the street and it is the residents of Silloth street who have to tidy up this mess in the morning. I personally have to on a regular basis clear up urine and vomit from around the doorway to my house which I find unacceptable.

Since Raymond has owned the club I have raised my concerns with him on a couple of occasions. He has always listened to me but I've never seen him take any positive action or improve things. Raymond told me he would stop having 18th birthday parties at the club but he still does and this leads to lots of problems with drunken youths on the street. Another problem is the foul language which is used by people in the car park, I can only describe this language as obscene and offensive. I have also heard a number of fights occurring in the car park.

All of the above has an extremely negative effect upon my quality of life. I have reported some incidents to the police but have became disgruntled with the repsonse.

Things have got so bad that on some Friday and Saturday nights I can't stay in my home and I have to go and stay with my daughter. It is embarrising to have friends and family at my house some evenings because of the disturbances and noise from the club. Swailes seems to please himself and runs the social club as a nigh club in a residential area having no regard for the residents. He seems quite happy to serve alcohol until people become very drunk and cause problems for the local residents. I know other residents have also been disturbed by Swailes irresponsible attitute to running a club.

The youths were running around vomiting and urinating on the street as well as smashing bottles and glasses on the street. All these people kept coming and going from the direction of the club. I assumed Raymond was entertaining an 18th brithday day party in the club. The drunken behaviour and numbers of pepole on the street was large so I called the police to dispurse the crowds, I could hear them from my house and the language on the street was appaulling.

This event at the club and the problems associated with it was by no means unusal and occurs on a regular basis. After this night on the 15th October I had to with my neighbours help clean the street up of broken glasses and bottles.

My main issue with the club is just the general noise and poor behaviour of the people who use the club. This club operates like a nightclub party venue and causes a great disturbance to the residents of the street who should not be disturbed by the irresponsible actions of Mr Swailes who clearly can't control the persons who use his club.

There have never been any great problems associated with the club until approximatley 3 years ago when Mr Raymond Swailes took over running the club. Since the nthe club has caused no ends of problems for the residents on the street. In summary the main issues that effect me from the club are noise, broken bottles and glasses being discarded on the street, people urinating on the street and generally drunken and disorderly behaviour used by people when they leave the club. The peak times for trouble seem to be Saturday evenings and Sunday afternoons. It is a regular occurance that at least on one Sunday morning in three I will have to clean up broken bottles and glasses from outside my house. This broken glass is also dangerous for childern who walk along the street to go to school. Historically and more recently I have noticed pools of urine on the street near to my house, when people leave the club they appear to use Silloth Street as a public toilet. In the summer of 2007 one evening at about 2300 hours I heard a lot of noise from directly outside my living room window, I opened the front door only to be confronted by two people having sex on

On a Saturday night Swailes often has loud parties at the club. This seems to attract lots of younger people and at closing time large numbers of drunken people congregate on the street waiting for taxis and lifts home. Sometimes fighting occurs and the general disorderly behaviour is terrible. The shouting and swearing I sometimes hear is terrible. Since the smoking ban problems at the club have also been worse, now people seem to congregate outside in the car park/yard of the club to drink and smoke. This creates a lot more noise at the club which can be heard along the whole length of Silloth Street. Now I can not go to bed with any windows open because of the noise it is impossible to sleep through. I have even on occasion taken to wearing ear plugs to block out the noise.

On a Sunday afternoon Swailes seems to have people attending the club to watch sporting events on the TV. People seem to sit outside and watch the TV, large numbers of people are drinking cheering and shouting at the telly, and because they are sat outside it is very noisy for the residents on the street.

I would describe the club as terrible its managed in a terrible way and this has a direct impact on my quality of life, because of the club my quality of life is poor. I am now 75 and would like to be able to live out the rest of my life in peace. The manager and people who use the club have no respect for the people living on the street and this situation must not be allowed to continue.

Since Swailes has been running the club there have been numerous incidents occurring which have a negative effect upon the residents of the street. In summary the problems are noise, broken glass on the street, fighting on the street, people drinking outside and drug taking. From my house I am directly effected by the issues at the club. The peak times for problems are evening weekends and summer weekend days. The noise which comes from the club is loud music people shouting and cars revving there engines. This noise is often so bad that is keeps me awake all night. On a weekend when the club shuts large numbers of people can congregate outside on the street waiting for taxis. These people are drunk and often have bottles and glasses of drink with them, they continue to drink on the street whilst waiting for taxis and they smash the bottles and glasses on the street when the taxis arrive. The groups of people on the street being drunk are very loud and the noise and foul language is terrible. The club is not double glazed and when music is being played it cac clearly be heard along the entire length pf the street. On a Sunday morning or Saturday morning my husband often goes outside onto the street to sweep up broken glass. My car has received about 3-4 punctures from broken glass in the last 3 years . I also often see fighting occurring on the street outside the club, this usually happens when a function is taking place in the club on a Friday or Saturday night. I have once seen a male fighting and he used what I would describe as an extendable stick to hit someone with. When people leave the club they seem to use Silloth Street as a toilet. This is a big problem and I often see men urinating on the street during the day and night.

I have seen men urinating on the street during the daytime which is unacceptable because children live on the street and use the street to walk along going to and from school.

I have on occasion had to clean up vomit and urine from my front door step which again is totally unacceptable.

I have also seen people in the car park of the club sniffing powder from the back of there hands, this appears to me to be an open form of drug taking which I see occurring often. There is no effort to disguise what is going on the drug taking is done openly so Swailes must know what is happening. When the football season is on large numbers of people are outside in the yard of the club watching the match through open doors. Because the doors are open the TV can be clearly heard and the crowds of people outside are drunk and rowdy. Since the smoking ban a number of picnic tables have appeared in the car park of the club. This has attacted people to drink outside and this again creates more noise from the club. Living in close proximity to the club is difficult and annoying. The noise from the club is disturbing my life at home and just in general the disorderly behaviour which is associated with the club should not be allowed to occur in a residential area and Swailes seems totally unconcerned with the effect his club has on the residents of the street.





ANNUEX 1 - LICENSING ACT 2003 MANDATORY CONDITIONS.

Licensing Act 2003 Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises the supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) The supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where Door Supervisors are provided

Where a premises licence includes a condition that one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH OPERATING SCHEDULE.

General

The premises will still be run as a members club and all members are subject of club rules.

- 1 The club will join the Pubwatch Scheme.
- 2 A tamper proof CCTV system shall be installed at the premises in liason with and to the satisfaction of Cumbria Police. The images recorded by the system shall be retained in unedited form for a period of not less than 28 days.
- 3 Two door supervisors (SIA) to work on Saturday evenings from 9pm.
- 4 Polycarbanate glasses to be used in function room for private functions.
- 5 All external doors and windows to be closed when regulated entertainment takes place.
- CCTV will be fitted no later than 27th April 2007 and conditions 1,3 &4 to be reviewed 6 months following licence issue.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

All members of Club are subject to Club rules. Anyone found to be in breach could lose membership.

All crimes committed at the premises will be reported to the Police.

Public Safety

All fire fighting equipment will be maintained, All signs displayed at all times.

All spillages will be cleaned immediately.

First Aid Kit will be on site and maintained.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

All doors and windows will be kept closed during Regulated Entertainment.

All members will be reminded regarding noise and litter issues and the effect on

local residents.

The Protection of children from harm

No person under 18yrs will be allowed on the premises, unless accompanied by an adult.

Staff will be made aware that if they are in doubt of a persons age then entrance will be refused,

To whom it may concern,

I would like to write to give my support to Mr Raymond Swailes and the Silloth Street Social Club. My husband and I have been attending the Silloth Street Social Club for 40+ years and have never been unhappy with the service and the atmosphere inside the club. Silloth Street Social Club is made up of members who all seem to get along well with each other, consisting of both the younger and older generations. The club has its own football and darts team which shows good community spirit and team work within the club as well as a sense of belonging.

It has been brought to our attention in the club that there have been a number of complaints made against Mr Swailes and the Silloth Street Social Club. I however cannot believe that the residents of the surrounding area can be justified into thinking that it is only that of Silloth Street Social club is to blame for causing disruption to the area. The club is situated in an area made up of 3 public houses, 2 social clubs, one being itself and the other one that is situated next door, along with 2 restaurants as well as 5 takeaway eating places. It is believed that Silloth Street Social Club is the cause for rubbish appearing in neighbour's gardens; however the houses surrounding the club do not have gardens so I do find this very hard to believe and I can't understand what kind of rubbish this would be as the club does not serve food to eat in or takeaway. The rubbish could have been thrown from a number of people who can pass these houses at any time of the day or night.

Another complaint which was said to have been made is the fact that there was supposed to be around 100 people standing outside smoking in the yard of the social club. This I also find hard to believe as it is very rare, unless there is a party or an event on in the social club that there would be 100 people drinking there at any one time, never mind them all deciding to smoke outside at the same time.

My final point considering the complaints is that of the one made about vomit being found on the doorsteps of the surrounding houses. I cannot see how neighbours can give good reason for the vomit being directly associated with that of the Silloth Street Social Club as there is also another Social Club situated right next door. It is a place where people are able to celebrate birthdays, weddings and christenings as well as funerals. And finally it is also a friendly and close-knit club with a nice atmosphere which would most definitely be greatly missed.




