Title: HOUSING GENERAL FUND REVIEW OF CHARGES 2003/04

Report of: THE CITY TREASURER AND THE DIRECTOR OF HOUSING

Report reference: FINANCIAL MEMO 2002/03 NO 50 & H061/2002

Summary:

The report advises Members of the proposed increase in charges for Hostels, including Supporting People charges.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that all charges be increased in line with the Corporate Charging Policy i.e. 1% above inflation, as set out in para 3.2 and that these changes take effect from 1 April 2003.

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2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND OPTIONS

- 1. This report considers Hostel rents for 2003/04, which fall within the General Fund.
- 2. The report has been prepared in accordance with the principles set out under the Council's current Corporate Charging Policy.
- 3. The charges which have been reviewed are addressed separately below.

3. CORPORATE CHARGING POLICY

- 1. The Corporate Charging Policy that was approved by the City Council on 16 July 2002 sets out an income target so as to produce an overall increase in income equal to inflation plus 1%.
- 2. Therefore, for 2003/04 each service is required to achieve a corporate target for income generation of 3.5% (RPI of 2.5% plus 1%) and the increases proposed have been set with this requirement in mind. In addition, the policy requires Service Managers to investigate the scope

for charging for services that have not been traditional charging areas.

4. HOSTELS

- 1. This service has in recent years had increases above the corporate policy levels to bring the rent more in line with other Social Housing providers. Other increases have also been necessitated for Health and Safety reasons and also in accordance with the Supporting People regime.
- 2. A review of the service provided by both the John Street and the London Road hostels is currently ongoing and until the review is completed it is recommended that the rents be increased in line with corporate guidance as detailed below:
