AMF Bowling have premises situated at Currock Road, Carlisle which has been used for ten pin bowling for a number of years. They intend to carry out structural alterations and wish to apply for a Public Entertainment Licence for the premises.

- Marcus Bryan Bloomfield and Andrew John Aspinall, representing AMF Bowling of Currock Road, Carlisle, make this application through Bond Pearce, incorporating Cartwrights Licensing Team.
- Applicants: Marcus Bryan Bloomfield of 130 Chesterholm, Carlisle and Andrew John Aspinall of 33 Clift Street, Carlisle
- 3. The application is for the grant of a provisional Public Entertainment Licence in respect of premises known as AMF Bowling, Currock Road, Carlisle (Appendix A).

AMF Bowling is situated behind Currock Road Filling Station, with industrial premises to one side and a railway line and residential property to the other (Appendix B).

The premises have been run as a ten pin bowling establishment for some years. Currently there are facilities for refreshments, pool and relaxation at the rear of the bowling lanes. The intention is to undertake substantial alterations to construct an area totally set aside from the bowling, to provide refreshments, music, singing, dancing and other entertainment of a like kind. The applicants have been asked to provide a plan showing the layout of the proposed alterations to the premises.

The hours of operation requested are:

Mondays to Saturday (inclusive): 1100 hours until 0100 hours the following day.

Sundays: 1200 hours until 0030 hours the following day, other than where the Sunday falls before a day which is a Bank Holiday, when the terminal hour will be 2am, other than Easter Sunday.

- 5. Schedule 1 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 is the legislation for the licensing of public entertainment. Section 15 of the Schedule reads as follows:
- (1) Where application is made to the appropriate authority for the grant of an entertainment's licence in respect of premises which are to be, or are in the course of being, constructed, extended or altered and the authority are satisfied that the premises would, if completed in accordance with plans deposited in accordance with the requirements of the authority, be such that they would grant a licence, the authority may grant the licence subject to a condition that it shall be of no effect until confirmed by them.
- (2) The authority shall confirm any licence granted by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph if and when they are satisfied that the premises have been completed in accordance with the plans referred to in sub-paragraph (1)

- above or in accordance with those plans as modified with the approval of the authority, and that the licence is held by a fit and proper person.
- 6. Cumbria Constabulary has no objections to the application. (Appendix C)
- 7. Cumbria Fire Service has informed the Licensing Officer that they cannot comment until such time as a copy of the planned alterations have been supplied to them.
- 8. Environmental Services have no objection to the application (Appendix D).
- 9. Planning Services Department have no observations to make (Appendix E).
- 10. Carlisle Access Group support the application (Appendix F).
- The application has been advertised in the local newspaper and no comments have been received.
- 12. A letter has been received from Bond Pearce with regard to the Electrical Safety Certificate which is required for premises holding a Public Entertainment Licence (Appendix G).

OPTIONS

- 1. To refuse the application
- To grant the provisional application subject to the Council's Licensing Officer being satisfied that the requirements of Cumbria Fire Service, Environmental Services Division and Planning Services are fully met and inspected and confirmed to that effect.
- 3. A current Electrical Safety Certificate is provided for the premises.
- 4. At least one of the named licence holders to be based in Carlisle.







As you are aware the Electrical Installation Inspection Certificate for these premises is outstanding and we have now been advised by our clients that in carrying out this inspection the electrical contractor has identified a number of defects.
