The Policy and Performance Officer submitted report PPP.21/10 enclosing the Carlisle and Eden Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership Plan for 2010/11.						
He outlined the background to the matter, informing Members that the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 placed statutory obligations on local authorities and the Police to act in co-operation with the Probation Service, Health Authorities and other relevant agencies; and to work together to develop and implement a Partnership Plan to tackle crime and disorder in their area. Section 97 of the Police Reform Act 2002 amended that obligation so that responsible authorities also included the Police Authority, Fire Service and Primary Care Trusts for the area. Further reforms now listed the Environment Agency and Residential Social Landlords as 'participatory bodies'.						
The legislation required the Partnership to produce a Plan covering the next three years and detailing how it intended to tackle crime and disorder; and allowing the development of strategies to tackle short, medium and long-term priorities. That also enabled alignment to other planning cycles, most notably the Local Area Agreement.						
The Policy and Performance Officer informed Members that a 'Strategic Assessment' was central to development of the Partnership Plan. The Assessment undertaken in September best reflected the most up-to-date needs of the communities. He added that the Plan required to be revised annually, allowing the Partnership to take account of new priorities emerging from the ongoing assessments conducted on a six monthly basis.						
The Community Overview and Scrutiny Panel was included in the consultation on the Strategic Assessment and helped to shape the Partnership Plan.
