The premises to be known as the Basement are to be situated at basement level below 10/14 Lowther Street, Carlisle. Application is made for a provisional Public Entertainment Licence in respect of the premises.

To the Chairman and Members of the Licensing & Regulatory Panel on 30th April 2003

- The Basement is a proposed development to be located below 10/14 Lowther Street, Carlisle (Appendix A). This location is below ground level in cellar type premises currently occupied by a number of small retail outlets. The premises are in the city centre and are located in an essentially business area. Application is made for a provisional Public Entertainment Licence in respect of the premises (Appendix B).
- Applicants: John Van Lierop, 48 Abbey Street, Carlisle Represented by Hilary Holland, Cartmell Shepherd, Solicitors.

Mr Van Lierop has many years experience in the licensing trade and currently has premises in Abbey Street, Carlisle

- 3) The hours of operation requested are:
- Monday to Saturday 1100 hours until 0200 hours the following day
- Sunday 1200 hours to 0030 hours the following day, other than where the Sunday falls before a day which is a Bank Holiday when the terminal hour will be 2am, other than Easter Sunday.

A letter has been received from Cartmell Shepherd clarifying the hours of operation in respect of Sundays (Appendix C)

4) Schedule 1 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 is the legislation for the licensing of public entertainment. Paragraph 2 (4) of the Schedule reads as follows:

"The appropriate authority may grant to any applicant, and from time to time renew, a licence for the use of any place specified in it for all or any part of the entertainment to which this paragraph applies on such terms and conditions and subject to such restrictions as may be so specified".

- 5) Environmental Services have no objections to the application. They comment that patrons leaving such an establishment can cause disturbance, however this is usually outside the scope of normal abatement legislation (Appendix D).
- 6) Planning Services confirm that planning consent was granted on 31st January 2003 subject to conditions regarding time limit on commencement of work, hours of trading, external advertising and to safeguard the visual amenity of the area (Appendix E).
- 9) Cumbria Fire Service has carried out an inspection of the premises and is not satisfied that the fire precautions at the premises are such as may reasonably be required in connection with the use of the premises. It is understood that the work required will be completed at the same time as the structural alterations are made (Appendix F).

- Carlisle Access Group requests assurance that a lift will be installed to overcome the entrance steps from Crosby Street (Appendix G).
- 11) Cumbria Constabulary has concern regarding the safety of customers using the front and rear entrances to the premises (Appendix H). They have spoken to representatives of Cartmell Shepherd and an agreement has been reached regarding the inclusion of two 'Special Conditions' should the application be granted. These conditions state that two registered Door Supervisors would be on duty after 6pm each day at point "A" on the plan (Appendix I) and only the Lowther Street entrance should be used other than by disabled persons or in the event of an emergency when any entrance may be used.
- 12) This application has been advertised in the local newspaper.



Means of Escape in Case of Fire

- 1.1 The small store adjacent to the disabled toilet should be enclosed in 30 minute fire resistant construction.
- 1.2 The roller shutter to be fitted over the kitchen servery opening should be made to descend in a controlled manner on operation of the fire alarm. The arrangement shown on the drawing could result in staff being enclosed in the kitchen in the event of operation of the alarm system. A thirty minute fire resisting self closing door should be provided in the enclosure to allow egress for staff.
- 1.3 In order to ensure the exit width between the bar and structural column is adequate bar stools must not be provided between the columns and the bar counter.
- 1.4 All glazing within 1.8 metres of the external stairway at ground floor level must be 30 minute fire resistant in frames fixed shut.
- 1.5 All emergency exit doors and any trapped leaf off an entrance door set must only be secured by emergency release devices of the horizontal push bar to open type.

Exit Signs and Notices

- 2.1 All exit signs must be of the maintained illuminated exit/fire exit box type sign to ensure adequate visibility of the signage.
- 2.2 All doors fitted with panic type emergency door released should have a notice worded PUSH BAR TO OPEN in white block lettering on a green background or a suitable pictogram fitted to the inside face of the door.
- 2.3 All fire resisting self-closing doors should be conspicuously indicated on both sides at about eye level with the words FIRE DOOR KEEP SHUT in white block lettering on a blue background.
- 2.4 The entrance doors to the store cupboards should be conspicuously indicated by a notice at about eye level with the words FIRE DOOR KEEP LOCKED in white block lettering on a blue background.

Fire Alarm

3.1 In addition to that indicated on the drawing the following rooms must be fitted with automatic rate of rise heat detectors:-

Basement

- a. store room beneath stairway adjacent to gents toilet
- small store room adjacent disabled toilet
- c. room containing refuse containers
- d. each toilet

Other Floors

- e. all rooms on other floors not currently fitted with automatic fire detection
- 3.2 All music systems must be muted automatically on operation of the fire alarm.

Fire Fighting Equipment

4.1 Firefighting equipment should be provided throughout the premises at suitable locations, and be appropriate to the risk to comply with BS 5306 Part 8: Selection and Installation of Portable Fire Extinguishers.

Emergency Lighting

5.1 Emergency lighting independent of the mains supply in accordance with BS 5266
Part 1 1999 Emergency Lighting, should be provided throughout the basement,
stairways and external exit routes. The installation indicated on the drawing is not
considered adequate and further luminaires should be fitted to make installation in
accord with the British Standard. If luminaires are not to be included in each toilet
cubicle, the design of the cubicles should allow illumination to enter from the
general emergency lighting provided in the toilet circulation areas.

Fire Procedures

6.1/ Printed notices should be displayed at conspicuous positions in the basement stating in concise terms the essentials of the action to be taken upon discovering a fire and upon hearing the alarm. The notices should be permanently fixed in position and suitably protected to prevent loss or defacement.

Fire Precautions (Workplace) Regulations 1997 As Amended 1999

7.1 On occupation of the premises where there are 5 or more persons employed, the employer must record the significant findings of the fire risk assessment to comply with the requirements of the fire regulations.

Thank you for your letter dated 7th April 2003 regarding the above premises. I believe that the application for a new Public Entertainment Licence in respect of these premises will be made before the Licensing and Regulatory Panel on 30th April 2003.

Cumbria Constabulary has some concerns regarding the safety of people using the premises in its new format, as proposed by Mr Van Lierop the proposed licensee and tenant. Our concerns are focused solely on issues of safety, specifically on the entrance and exit of the premises as proposed.

- The main entrance to the venue is below street level on Lowther Street. The front door to the premises is under ground, with access to the front entrance down steep sandstone steps from Lowther Street through a passageway to the main entrance. This is of concern due to the inability of the management of the premises being able to prevent undesirable clientele entering the premises at street level. The first opportunity that staff has to prevent unwelcomed guests will be at the door, in a close confined area. From a safety perspective, being able to prevent people from entering licensed premises at ground level is much safer. I will expand on this argument at the Licensing Panel on 30th April.
- One of the entrances to the proposed premises is on Crosby Street. This is a small back street, which links Lonsdale Street and Warwick Road. Cumbria Constabulary has concerns about people queuing, entering from and exiting onto Crosby Street due to it being a quiet and currently poorly lit back street.

Cumbria Constabulary will not object to the proposed provisional grant of a Public Entertainment Licence if two special conditions are imposed on the licence for the premises.

 "The licensee shall ensure that whenever the licensed premises are open to the public for the sale of intoxicating liquor or for the provision of public entertainment after 6.00 p.m. on any day of the week two registered door supervisors will be on Lowther street, Carlisle at the entrance to the steps leading to the basement at the point marked 'A' on the approved plans to control admission to the premises and to prevent queuing on the steps and / or the passageway leading to the entrance at basement level."

2) "The entrance on Lowther Street is the only entrance and exit point for members of the public except for emergency situations when all exits are available for use. The only exception to this is for disabled access for which the most appropriate entrance point can be used."

The purpose of these conditions is due to the need to ensure safety and to reduce the likelihood of crime and disorder on and around the premises.

These conditions have been agreed with Mr Barnes of Cartmell Shepherd solicitors on behalf of Mr Van Lierop as special conditions to the provisional grant of a Public Entertainment Licence if the Licensing and Regulatory panel is in agreement, for the purpose of promoting and ensuring public safety.
