Carlisle Conference Group

Carlisle Conference Group (CCG) has begun the new financial year with cautious optimism following the troubled year the tourism industry faced in 2001. Planning and preparation for what was thought to have been a particularly tough year in 2002 began last November.

Statistics (attached) to the end of July 2002, show year on year increases in all areas except revenue. Last year, the revenue figure at the end of July was £64,074 compared with the £19,827 this year. However, this was expected, as 2 events last year (held in May & June 2001) netted over £46,000 into venues between them. Achieving this year's revenue target of £135,000 (approximately a 10% increase on last year's final figure) will be difficult, as there are no high value one-off events booked in for this year, but the Group does continue to strive to meet this target. The conversion rate from enquiry to booking continues to remain at around 60%.

On 19th July, CCG hosted a corporate race day at Carlisle Racecourse. This is the first time that CCG has sponsored an event and was chosen as a marketing tool to thank and maintain existing clients as well as increase our profile in line with the Marketing & Business Action Plan. The day, although wet, was hailed a success and around 75 clients attended. The Deputy Mayor, Cllr Mrs Judith Pattinson attended the event and this added to the credibility of CCG in the market place. Funds permitting, CCG will look to repeat this event in 2003.

Thanks to funding from Business Link for Cumbria, this year will see a new marketing tool for CCG, with its conference brochure being reproduced on to 1000 CD-Rom's. Once produced (early September), this will be mailed out to selected current users and potential new users of the service.

In a further profiling initiative, CCG has sponsored one of the panels on the new Tourist Information Point (TIP) at Carlisle Railway Station. In addition to

this 'billboard' advert, there is racking for the CCG brochure. The TIP is located on platform 4 adjacent to the station entrance / exit doors.

From 17th – 19th September, CCG will have a stand presence at the National Venue Show in Birmingham. This event is held at the NEC and following the success of last year's show, attracts a wide range of buyers looking for new venues and destinations for their events. Should anyone be in the area, CCG will be on Stand D30 and complimentary entrance tickets are available from the Conference Group Officer.

CCG's venue portfolio has been broadened and includes 3 new venues: Carlisle Racecourse, The Lord Edmond at Hayton Hall and Capital HR.

Monthly Unemployment Briefing - June 2002

The June 2002 unemployment figures were released by the Office for National Statistics today.

UK Claimant Count

The number of people out of work and claiming unemployment benefit across the UK fell by 17,419 to 937,039. The unemployment rate has fallen by 0.1% to 3.1% of the workforce.

(The seasonally adjusted figure for the UK rose by 1,300 to 952,400, which is 3.2%. This is the "headline rate" commonly used in the national media – no seasonally adjusted figures are available for local areas. Therefore, this figure should not be used to compare local and national rates. Similarly, the ILO unemployment rate quoted nationally ["the Government's preferred measure"] is not available for local areas.)

County Claimant Count

The number of people out of work and claiming unemployment benefit in Cumbria fell by 285 to 6,909. The unemployment rate is 3.0% of the workforce, 0.1% below the national rate.

In the same month last year, the Cumbria rate stood at 3.2%, giving a year on year fall of 0.2 percentage points. Over the year unemployment in the county has fallen more quickly than the national figure.

Male Unemployment: fell by 219 to 5,341 which is 4.3%, the same as the UK figure. Female Unemployment: fell by 66 to 1,568 which 1.4%, 0.2% below the UK figure.

Monthly Unemployment Briefing - July 2002

The July 2002 unemployment figures were released by the Office for National Statistics today.

UK Claimant Count

The number of people out of work and claiming unemployment benefit across the UK rose by 19,344 to 956,377. The unemployment rate has risen by 0.1% to 3.2% of the workforce.

(The seasonally adjusted figure for the UK fell by 3,100 to 949,600, which is 3.1%. This is the "headline rate" commonly used in the national media – no seasonally adjusted figures are available for local areas. Therefore, this figure should not be used to compare local and national rates. Similarly, the ILO unemployment rate quoted nationally ["the Government's preferred measure"] is not available for local areas.)

County Claimant Count

The number of people out of work and claiming unemployment benefit in Cumbria rose by 103 to 7,012. The unemployment rate is 3.0% of the workforce, 0.2% below the national rate.

In the same month last year, the Cumbria rate stood at 3.2%, giving a year on year fall of 0.2 percentage points. Over the year unemployment in the county has fallen more quickly than the national figure.

Male Unemployment: rose by 10 to 5,351 which is 4.3%, 0.1% below the UK figure. Female Unemployment: rose by 93 to 1,661 which is 1.5%, 0.2% below the UK figure.
