EXCERPT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE 29 OCTOBER 2012

EX.122/12 **HIGHER LEVEL STEWARDSHIP GRANT

(Key Decision – KD.035/12)

Portfolio Environment and Transport

Relevant Overview and Scrutiny Panel Environment and Economy

Subject Matter

The Environment and Transport Portfolio Holder reported (LE.30/12) that, as a major landowner in the Carlisle area, the City Council qualified for agri-environmental grants in the same way as private farmers.

In the past the grants awarded to the Council included Countryside Stewardship (for agricultural land) and Woodland Grant Scheme (for woodlands). Those agreements were typically for a 10 year period and previous recipient sites included Talkin Tarn. With an annual payment of £22,800 the total for the 10 years of the agreement was £228,000 for both revenue and capital items.

Having come to the end of an Entry Level Scheme for Countryside Stewardship, the Council now qualified for the Higher Level Scheme (HLS) under which the potential payments were increased. Officers had been working for some months, with assistance from Natural England's advisers, to enter as much of the City Council's land as possible into the scheme in order to maximise the value of the grant.

The Environment and Transport Portfolio Holder drew Members' attention to the complete list of sites for which HLS had been offered. She further outlined the purpose and conditions of the grant; and the levels of payment. The options open to the Council were:

- a. Do not accept the grant;
- b. Accept the grant in part; or
- c. Accept the grant in whole

The Portfolio Holder alluded to the lively debate at the Environment and Economy Overview and Scrutiny Panel meeting on 25 October 2012 (EEOSP.65/12), when the Panel had resolved:

- "1) That Report LE.36/12 on the Higher Level of Stewardship grant offer be noted.
- 2) That the Panel was supportive of acceptance of the grant in part (Option B) and the views of the Panel be conveyed to the Executive."

Copies of an Excerpt from the draft Minutes of the meeting had been circulated.

In conclusion, the Environment and Transport Portfolio Holder moved the recommendations, which were duly seconded by the Leader.

Summary of options rejected Options a. and b. set out in Report LE.30/12

DECISION

- 1. That the Executive recommended acceptance of the Higher Level Scheme grant to full Council in accordance with the Council's Budget and Policy procedure, and accepted the conditions of grant in full.
- 2. That the Executive delegated the Director of Local Environment to sign the agreement on behalf of Carlisle City Council.

To enable the Council's Green Spaces Team to improve the management and maintenance of the sites listed within the report.

EX.131/12 **HIGHWAYS CLAIMED RIGHTS

Subject Matter

Pursuant to Minute EX.119/12, the Environment and Transport Portfolio Holder submitted private report LE.29/12 concerning the review of Highways Claimed Rights (HCR).

The Environment and Transport Portfolio Holder set out the background to the matter reminding Members that since 2001 the City Council had, under Section 42 of the Highways Act 1980, "Claimed Rights" to carry out highways maintenance on all urban unclassified roads in the district.

The City Council had, in conjunction with the County Council, commissioned a consultant to take an independent view on the future of HCR and to report on the options. A copy of the Consultants report was appended.

Details of the three options considered for the future, together with the main conclusions drawn from the study of each option were provided.

The Environment and Economy Overview and Scrutiny Panel had, on 13 September 2012, considered the matter.

The Chairman of the Environment and Economy Overview and Scrutiny Panel made reference to the very good presentation and discussions which had taken place. He then outlined the recommendations made, namely:

"That the Panel recommend option 2, as set out in report LE.27/12, to the Executive as the preferred option.

The Panel ask that the Executive use their best endeavours to negotiate equal representation for Carlisle City Council on the Cumbria County Council Highways and Transport Working Group.

Councillor Bainbridge abstained from voting on the matter."

A copy of Minute Excerpt EEOSP.54/12 had been circulated.

Joint meetings between representatives of the City and County Councils had taken place on 12 September and 16 October 2012. Copies of the notes thereof were also provided.

In conclusion, the Environment and Transport Portfolio Holder moved the recommendations set out in the report, which were duly seconded by the Leader.

Summary of options rejected Other options detailed within private report LE.29/12

DECISION

That the Executive had given consideration to the comments of the Environment and Economy Overview and Scrutiny Panel of 13 September 2012; together with the recommendations set out in the Consultant report, attached as Appendix 1 to Report LE.29/12.

- 1. That the Executive made recommendations to the City Council, in accordance with the Council's Budget and Policy Framework as set out in the report and in agreement with the recommendations of the Environment and Economy Overview and Scrutiny Panel, to support Option 2: terminate the current claimed right to carry out the highways maintenance of all urban unclassified roads in the district and instead work in co-operation with the County Council in the delivery of a residual highways service either
 - (a) on such day as may be agreed between the City Council and the County Council, or
 - (b) six months after the receipt by the County Council of a notice from the City Council stating the intention to cease to exercise those powers.
- 2. Subject to approval by Council, the Executive delegated authority to the Director of Local Environment, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Local Environment and the Director of Governance, to agree the terms of the termination; any transitional arrangements; and a new residual Highways Agreement with the County Council with a date for new arrangements to come into place in 2013.

18/12 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was submitted on behalf of Councillor Watson, Chairman of the Resources Overview and Scrutiny Panel.

19/12 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

The minutes of the meeting held on 3 July 2012 were considered.

13/12 – Scrutiny of Welfare Reform

Councillor Whalen informed the Group that he had been researching the impact of the Welfare Reform and had information if any Members required copies. There were a number of issues regarding the Reform and redundancies within Carlisle. The Group welcomed the support being provided by a number of agencies within the City.

AGREED – That the minutes of the Scrutiny Chairs Group held on 3 July 2012 be agreed as a correct record of the meeting.

20/12 CIVIC CALENDAR 2013/14

Ms Rooney submitted the draft Civic Calendar for 2013/14 for comment. In previous years there had been an issue with JMT clashing with Overview and Scrutiny Panels. This year the Executive moved the JMT meetings to 4.00pm which eliminated the clash.

There were concerns raised that, although the attendance to Scrutiny meetings had improved, there had been an increase in the number of Members who left part way through the meeting, particularly around noon. The Group felt that the Scrutiny meetings were important and Members should make themselves available to attend the full meetings and they should expect the meetings to last until at least 1.00pm. The Agenda for the meetings would highlight any requirements for lunch etc if the meetings were likely to run in to the afternoon.

AGREED – 1) That the draft dates and times of meetings for 2013/14 be approved.

2) That the concerns of the Group regarding Members of Scrutiny leaving part way through the meetings be highlighted with Group Leaders.

21/12 CHAIRS TRAINING

Councillor Whalen reminded the Group of the Scrutiny Chairs and Vice Chairs Training on Purposeful Meetings which had taken place in July 2012. He asked how the Chairs had used this training and if they had any suggestions for further training.

The Group all felt that the training had been particular useful and continued to use the literature as part of their role. They suggested training for new Members of Scrutiny and asked that opportunities to share training with other authorities be explored further.

They agreed that Task and Finish Groups had been very successful and were a practical way for in depth Scrutiny which Members enjoyed taking part in.

The Group noted that a number of reports had been through Scrutiny before being considered by the Executive and agreed that the process had helped to promote open and honest discussions which informed the decisions of the Executive in a much more timely manner.

The Group were disappointed that members of the local press did not attend Scrutiny meetings or publish outcomes or debates from the meetings. They agreed that Scrutiny should use the Council's press officer to promote the work of Scrutiny.

AGREED – 1) That training be arranged for new Members of Scrutiny in collaboration with other authorities where possible.

2) That discussions take place with the Council's press officer to consider how best to promote the work of Scrutiny.

It was confirmed that a Budget Scrutiny workshop had not been arranged for this budget cycle due to the Executive releasing their savings proposals earlier. The proposals were considered by each Panel before the full budget would come through Scrutiny.
