# To the Chairman and Members of the Development Control Committee

# 1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The ODPM has recently released statistical information covering the performance of Local Planning Authorities in England and Wales for the three months from October to December 2004.
- 1.2 The most recent Government release disclosed that in the period from October to December last year the pattern of increasing numbers of planning submissions was maintained. During the period a total of 159,000 planning applications were lodged, the highest total for that particular quarter since 1988 and 3% higher than the corresponding period in 2003.
- 1.3 The number of decisions made in the quarter also increased by 4% compared to a year earlier, with the North West Region increasing by 5% in decisions compared to the same quarter of 2003. This is the largest number decided in this period since 1988. As noted in previous Statistical Releases, the single largest factor that accounts for that increase is the growth in the number of householder applications, which nationally rose from 77,600 to 78,900 in the same corresponding periods in 2003 and 2004. This accounts for over half of all decisions. The number of decisions relating to new dwellings also increased from 19,100 to 21,500 and accounts for 12% of all decisions.
- 1.4 The speed of decision also rose with 77% of all decisions made in the quarter being within 8 weeks, an increase of 6% over the corresponding period in 2003.

  Decisions made within 13 weeks of receipt rose by 2% to 89%.
- 1.5 Members will be aware that the Government has set "Performance Standards" against which all Authorities can be measured in dealing with "Major", "Minor" and "Other" applications. These targets are instrumental in determining the level of Planning Delivery Grant awarded to each Council. The targets are for 60% of all "Major" applications decided within 13 weeks of receipt, 65% of decisions on "Minor" applications to be made within 8 weeks and 80% of all decisions on "Other" applications to be made within the 8 week period.

- 1.6 In national terms, 55% of decisions on "Major" applications met the target, 67% of applications for "Minor" applications were decided within 8 weeks or less and 83% of "Other" applications were decided within 8 weeks of submission. These represent respectively a 4%, 7% and 6% improvement over the October to December 2003 period. It is notable, however, that 44% of Authorities met the Performance Standard for "Major" applications, 66% achieved the Standard for "Minor" applications and 70% achieved the Standard for "Other" applications.
- As regards Carlisle City Council's performance over the period this requires some 1.7 comment particularly since the Development Control Section was operating at reduced capacity in the quarter, due to the vacancy in the Principal Officer post and prior to the appointment of an Assistant Planning Officer in November. Nonetheless the Council considered more applications in the quarter (372) compared to the same period in 2003 (333) but determination within targets for the "Major" category was considerably lower compared with the corresponding period in 2003 (14% 2004, 67% 2003). The Council's performance increased within the "Minor" category (63% 2004, 59% 2003) and the "Other" category (83% 2004, 77% 2003). Although there was a large reduction in the target on the "Major" applications of 53%, the increase in numbers of applications coupled with the 4% and 6% increase on "Minor" and "Other" applications is still an improvement. The Council decided 37 "Major" applications within the whole year of 2004. Of those 37, 7 were within the October to December period (the period covered by these statistics), resulting in 19% of the total "Major" applications being determined within this statistical period. With this in mind and factors such as many of the majors requiring Section 106 agreements and considerable external consultations involvement often external, this figure is understandable.
- 1.8 The Council's performance over this quarter does not meet the Best Value targets for "Major", "Minor" and "Other" applications. The situation is continually monitored, however, and ways of improving these areas will be considered in the Planning Services Business Plan for 2005/06 and in future reports to this Committee.
