

50p per visit adds up when there are more than one child in the family – adding transport and refreshment money to this may make an expensive night to some families – does the Zone have any type of hardship policy?

- It costs approx. £500 a year for a young person utilising the Youth Zone
- Parent contribution for the year is £30 a child
- 3 children for 2 nights a week is only £3 less than a packet of Cigarettes parental responsibility and ownership
- Transport to the CYZ is discounted through stage coach
- We are exploring how to identify families in need and offer subsidy for additional cost activities
- Developing positive healthy eating free fruit at the holiday club – working with schools on FSM data
- Targeted groups may have free membership & access through organisation deals

What are the risks to the Zone and what are the strategies to address these?

- Our success advance planning, growth strategy and working in partnership
- Integration of diverse population revised plans establish equity culture, partnership working
- Lack of trust with partners consistent message, real examples of success
- Public Sector funding beyond 2013

Details on the financial viability of the Zone.

- Finance is balanced for 2011-12
- Confident for 2012-13
- Strategy in place for a variety of funding streams
- Partnership working and colaboration
 - Public money invested for bigger return
- Phase 2 development of targeted services
- Quality work with visible impact and positive outcomes will generate income from all streams


