GENERAL FUND CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2002/03 AND 2003/04

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND OPTIONS

- 1.1 This report sets out the summarised provisional financial out-turn for the General Fund Capital Programme as follows:
 - Appendix 1 Details the out-turn for individual schemes
 - Appendix 2 Details the revised programme for 2003/04
- 1.2 Please note that throughout this report a minus (-) figure represents a favourable variance i.e. either an underspend or additional income received.

SUMMARY FINANCIAL OUTTURN 2002/03

2.1 Appendix 1 details the out-turn for schemes included within the General Fund Capital programme compared to the revised budget approved by Council in February 2003. The totals provided in Appendix 1 are summarised in the table below:

This report sets out below the financial implications arising from the out-turn including the impact on the capital resource implications for 2003/04.

3. EXPLANATION OF MAJOR VARIANCES

- 3.1 During the year, as well as the deferment of purchases totalling £532,262 which will be funded in 2003/04, 6 items of vehicles, plant and equipment amounting to £58,931 were financed via an operational lease as opposed to being funded from the Repairs and Renewals Reserve. This has resulted in a reduced call on the Repairs and Renewals Reserve in 2002/03 of £591,193. Members of the Executive should note that Internal Audit staff are currently conducting a VFM study into the use of the Repairs and Renewals Reserve, the results of which will be reported to a future meeting of the Executive.
- 3.2 The Millennium Gateway Scheme underspend of £738,718 can be mainly attributed to the delay in the submission of final elements in respect of the many works packages awarded in respect of the project. This sum will need to be carried forward as slippage into 2003/04 to complete the scheme.

4. FINANCING OF CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2002/03

4.1 Utilisation of resources to fund the Capital Programme in the light of the out-turn is provisionally estimated as follows:

- Outstanding grant claims in respect of Hammonds Pond. The claim has been approved and will be paid in June 2003.
- 3. Usable capital receipts carried forward from 2001/02 and those generated during 2002/03 amount to £1,295,360 compared to the revised estimate figure of £1,036,940, an increase of £258,420. Of this sum £449,043 has been used to fund the General Fund Capital Programme in 2002/03, with the balance (£846,317) being carried forward to 2003/04.
- 4. The City Council is entitled to an additional Basic Credit Approval (BCA) of £91,592 as a result of movements in the level of credit cover provided on Kingmoor Park properties at the time it ceased to be a Local Authority controlled company compared with the position 12 months earlier. This adjustment only applies to 2002/03.

CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2003/04

5.1 The revised Capital Programme for 2003/04 totalling £7,706,323 is detailed in Appendix 2 along with the revised budgets for those other schemes funded from Capital Resources. This is based upon the programme as agreed by Council in February 2003, together with the commitments brought forward from the previous financial year as identified. A supplementary estimate is also included which was approved by the Executive in April 2003 in relation to Raffles Vision amounting to £407,100 (£249,100 and £158,000 for 2003/04 and 2004/05 respectively) as well as a carry forward request from the Public sector HIP for Raffles totalling £293,686. The replacement of certain vehicles totalling £82,000 was deferred until 2004/05 (report CTS 07/03) and the budgets have been adjusted accordingly. These, together with the relevant proposed methods of financing, will ultimately require approval by full Council.

Notes:

The total Millennium Gallery budget amounts to £9,768,150. The anticipated 'worst' case final cost is estimated at £172,000 in excess of that budget. The main causes of the overspend concern the Irish Gate Bridge (£33,000), the Gallery (£146,000) and Post Excavation Archaeology (£28,000). Whilst this adds up to £207,000 in total, underspends of £35,000 have occurred elsewhere, reducing the net overspend to £172,000. Details regarding the variations are discussed as part of

the Head of Legal & Democratic Services Report (LDS.35/03) elsewhere on this agenda.

It must be emphasised that this is the worst case scenario and negotiations are still taking place around the final contract payment. The 'best' case final estimated expenditure on the project as presented in LDS.35/03 provides an excess of £74,000. In their earlier reports to the Executive MPM Capita indicated that they estimated that the potential outurn cost range for the Gallery only (excluding Irish Gate Bridge) would be between the Councils approved budget and up to £100,000 over that. The final figure being dependant on the settlement point in respect of the accounts opposite the various works packages. This report has been prepared on the assumption that the 'worst' case scenario of £172,000 is to be financed in 2003/04.

2. The finds from the Gateway project were stored at Shaddonmill previously leased by Carlisle Archaeology. As a consequence of Carlisle Archaeology Limited ceasing trading, the City Council agreed to take on the lease in order that the Oxford Archaeology Unit could have access to the finds, during the estimated 5 year period of the conservation programme. The City Council agreed to indemnify and reimburse Bradford University (Carlisle Archaeology's parent) against the costs of holding the lease until the transfer could be completed. That dates back to September 2001.

In reporting this matter to Committee in 2001 the City Treasurer recommended that the cost should fall against the capital cost of the post archaeological conservation programme, since that was the purpose for taking the lease in the first instance. This report has been prepared on the assumption that the relevant costs, as detailed in the table, are financed in 2003/04 and future costs will be incorporated into the forward capital programme.
