Steve Dennis and Trevor Ellard representing Luminar Leisure Limited of 41 King Street, Luton, make this application through their solicitors Poppleston Allen.

The application is for the grant of a provisional Public Entertainment Licence in respect of new premises to be called Jumpin' Jaks (Appendix A). The site is Unit 7, Portlands, Botchergate, Carlisle, an area that is to be shortly redeveloped (Appendix B).

The hours of operation requested are:

Mondays to Saturday (inclusive): 1100 hours until 0200 hours the following day.

Sundays: 1100 hours until 0100 hours the following day, other than where the Sunday falls before a day which is a Bank Holiday, when the terminal hour will be 2am, other than Easter Sunday.

Applicants: Steve Dennis and Trevor Ellard of 41 King Street, Luton.

Schedule 1 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 is the legislation for the licensing of public entertainment. Section 15 of the Schedule reads as follows:

- (1) Where application is made to the appropriate authority for the grant of an entertainment's licence in respect of premises which are to be, or are in the course of being, constructed, extended or altered and the authority are satisfied that the premises would, if completed in accordance with plans deposited in accordance with the requirements of the authority, be such that they would grant a licence, the authority may grant the licence subject to a condition that it shall be of no effect until confirmed by them.
- (2) The authority shall confirm any licence granted by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph if and when they are satisfied that the premises have been completed in accordance with the plans referred to in sub-paragraph (1) above or in accordance with those plans as modified with the approval of the authority, and that the licence is held by a fit and proper person.

Cumbria Police has no objections to the application. (Appendix C)

Cumbria Fire Service has no objections. (Appendix D)

Environmental Services cannot comment effectively until all works on the premises have been completed but do not object as long as all of their requirements are met prior to opening (Appendix E).

Planning Services Department have no observations to make (Appendix F).

Carlisle Access Group comments regarding the access for disabled people. It is understood that the problem with the door widths and disabled toilets has been resolved.

The application has been advertised in the local newspaper and no comments have been received.

A letter has also been sent to a local resident who has objected to previous applications in the area and again no comments have been received.

It is recommended that the panel consider the options below after hearing the representations made by the applicants.

OPTIONS

- 1. To refuse the application
- To grant the provisional application subject to the Council's Licensing Officer being satisfied that the requirements of Cumbria Fire Service, Environmental Services Division and Planning Services are fully met and inspected and confirmed to that effect.
- 3. At least one of the named licence holders to be based in Carlisle.


