Purpose / Summary:

Jason Barnes is a licensed Hackney Carriage Driver with this Council. On the 25th of November 2013 a complaint was received from a member of the Civic Centre staff who had witnessed Mr Barnes using a hand held mobile phone whilst driving his taxi.

LICENSING HISTORY

On the 5th of March 2001 Mr Barnes applied for a Private Hire driver's licence. The members refused this application because of his previous criminal convictions for dishonesty.

On the 17th of April 2002 Mr Barnes again applied for a Private Hire driver's licence and this time it was successful. The licence was however issued together with a letter of warning regarding his future conduct. **APPENDIX 1**

Since being licensed the following matters have come to light.

28/09/01 Speeding Fixed Penalty & 3pts

This offence took place on the 13th of July 2001 and he was sentenced on the 19th of October 2001. This offence was not declared to the members of The Licensing Panel when they granted his licence on the 17th of April 2002. See copy of his driving licence at the time **APPENDIX 2** and a copy of his statutory declaration presented to the Licensing Panel **APPENDIX 3**.

01/03/04 Speeding Fixed Penalty & 3pts

11/03/05 Obstruction of a Pedestrian Crossing Fined £120 & 3pts

On the 7th of March 2007 the Council's Access Officer contacted the Licensing Office to make a complaint against Mr Barnes. She claimed she had followed him for some considerable time in slow moving traffic on Dalston Road and that he had been using his mobile phone the whole time. She claimed he had the phone resting between his ear and his shoulder. When interviewed he denied the allegation claiming it was in fact his two-way radio. He also claimed he didn't own a mobile phone on medical advice after suffering an earlier brain haemorrhage.

13/09/13 Failing to conform to a traffic light Fined £200 & 3pts

Mr Barnes appeared before The Regulatory Panel on the 20th November 2013 because of this offence. He informed the members that he refused a fixed penalty ticket and chose to

instead have the matter dealt with at The Magistrates Court where he intended to plead not guilty and produce his passenger as a witness. He claimed he never received the summons and he was found guilty by the Magistrates in his absence. The members decided to take no further action against Mr Barnes as they felt there was some confusion as to whether he had been given the opportunity to appeal the decision. Since the Panel hearing the Licensing Officer had been in touch with both Carlisle Magistrates Court and the Police CJU at Barrow who issued the paperwork. Both have confirmed that the necessary paperwork was sent to Mr Barnes in the same envelope as the police witness statement, which Mr Barnes has admitted he received. This paperwork

was not returned to the issuing office so the case went ahead without him being present.

Upon receiving the decision of the Court he should have appealed the decision if he felt he

had been unfairly treated.

LATEST COMPLAINT

On the 25th of November 2013 a member of the Council's Chief Executive's Department contacted the Licensing Office to make a complaint against Mr Barnes. He complained that Mr Barnes had turned right from Hartington Street into Victoria Place and had failed to see him turning left into Victoria Place from Chatsworth Square opposite. The vehicles nearly collided and would have done if the complainant hadn't taken evasive action. He claimed that the reason the taxi driver failed to see him was that he was using his mobile phone at the time. He continued to use his phone along Victoria Place, Georgian Way, around Hardwick Circus and onto Castleway. **APPENDIX 4**

When interviewed Mr Barnes at first denied even being in the area at that time. When he was told that we had contacted the owner of the taxi and he had confirmed that he was, Mr Barnes remembered he had been to Trinity School. He denied there had been any sort of road incident or that he had been using a mobile phone. Mr Barnes was told that if we couldn't sort the complaint out between us it would have to be referred to The Regulatory Panel. The discussion then ended without being resolved.

OPTIONS

It is recommended that after hearing the evidence and any representations from Mr Barnes, members reach a decision in line with the options available:

- To take no further action
- To issue a warning letter

- To suspend Mr Barnes' Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence for a period of time.
- As well as or instead of the above, require him to sit and pass a Driving Standards Agency 'Taxi' Test
- To revoke his Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence

Dear Sir,

I would like to bring to your attention the actions and behaviour of a taxi driver at 9:20 this morning in Carlisle. The taxi being driven was a Ford Mondeo PY10 DYA.

The taxi was turning right from Hartington Street on to Victoria Place and was unaware of me turning left from Chatsworth Square (see map overleaf). He nearly collided into the side of my car and would have done so if I had not taken evasive action. I could clearly see that the driver was in conversation on a mobile phone held up against his left ear.

At the top of Victoria Place the taxi turned right on to Georgian Way and then left at Hardwicke Circus on to Castle Way. At this point the driver was still on his mobile phone.

Let me know if you need any further info. I feel it was totally irresponsible of the taxi driver. There were also a number of students on foot heading towards the college he could have easily collided with.

61 Suspension and revocation of drivers' licences.

- (1) Notwithstanding anything in the Act of 1847 or in this Part of this Act, a district council may suspend or revoke or (on application therefor under section 46 of the Act of 1847 or section 51 of this Act, as the case may be) refuse to renew the licence of a driver of a hackney carriage or a private hire vehicle on any of the following grounds:—
 - (a) that he has since the grant of the licence—
 - (i) been convicted of an offence involving dishonesty, indecency or violence; or
 - (ii) been convicted of an offence under or has failed to comply with the provisions of the Act of 1847 or of this Part of this Act; or
 - (b) any other reasonable cause.
- (2) (a) Where a district council suspend, revoke or refuse to renew any licence under this section they shall give to the driver notice of the grounds on which the

- licence has been suspended or revoked or on which they have refused to renew such licence within fourteen days of such suspension, revocation or refusal and the driver shall on demand return to the district council the driver's badge issued to him in accordance with section 54 of this Act.
- (b) If any person without reasonable excuse contravenes the provisions of this section he shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding [F1]level 1 on the standard scale].
- [F2(2A) Subject to subsection (2B) of this section, a suspension or revocation of the licence of a driver under this section takes effect at the end of the period of 21 days beginning with the day on which notice is given to the driver under subsection (2)(a) of this section.
 - (2B) If it appears that the interests of public safety require the suspension or revocation of the licence to have immediate effect, and the notice given to the driver under subsection (2) (a) of this section includes a statement that that is so and an explanation why, the suspension or revocation takes effect when the notice is given to the driver.]
 - (3) Any driver aggrieved by a decision of a district council under [F3subsection (1) of] this section may appeal to a magistrates' court.
