Summary:

This is the inaugural report in a series which will establish arrangements for the scrutiny of the activities of the Carlisle Partnership by Carlisle City Council. The Chairman of the Carlisle Partnership, Healthy Communities and Older People Priority Group (Dr Jenni Payne) will present the first years' activities of the group and describe the intentions and plans for the remainder of 2007/2008.

The Carlisle Partnership Manager will present the procedures for scrutiny of the group's activities and on the continuing scrutiny of the Cumbria Agreement – delivery and performance monitoring.

Questions for / input required from Overview and Scrutiny:

- 1. Will the procedure described in the report enable the Committee to discharge its functions regarding the Priority Group and the Local Area Agreement?
- 2. Is the information provided in the report adequate, to enable the Committee to establish a baseline against which further reports from the Priority Group can be assessed?
- 3. Is the Cumbria Local Area Agreement First Quarter Performance Report a useful introduction for the further development of scrutiny in this area?

Introduction

1. It is proposed to report the proceedings of the Healthy Communities and Older People Priority Group of the Carlisle Partnership (Local Strategic Partnership), at the beginning and end of the civic year, to Carlisle City Council's Community, Overview and Scrutiny Committee. The report will be presented by the Chair of the group supported by the Carlisle Partnership Manager.

Typically the reports are expected to contain:

- A. Brief summaries of significant discussions and decisions.
- B. Brief summaries of group supported activities.
- C. Progress reports on significant projects.
- D. Future Plans.
- E. Group membership, resource and administrative issues.

It is intended that the committee will develop (over time) lines of enquiry/interest which can then provide the focus for more detailed reporting in the future.

2. In addition it is proposed to use these opportunities to report performance monitoring on the delivery of the Healthy Communities and Older People theme of the Cumbria Local Area Agreement. It is important to note that the reporting of the LAA performance will be dependent on the availability of data from the Cumbria Strategic Partnership.

<u>Carlisle Partnership – Healthy Communities and Older Peoples</u>

The information provided is a summary only. The intention is to establish a base line from which the committee will be able to decide upon lines of enquiry and interest (regarding particular issues or projects) to follow through to the end of this year and on into next.

3. The group was inaugurated in Spring 2006 at a meeting Hosted by Carlisle Housing Association. Patrick Leonard (Chief Executive of CHA) was invited to chair the group for its first year. Regular monthly meetings have continued kindly hosted (and supported clerically) by CHA. The following organisations are regularly represented:

Jenni Payne, Assistant Director of Public Health for North Cumbria has recently (autumn 2007) taken on the role of chair of the "HCOP". Jenni has worked in the NHS in North Cumbria for nearly thirty years, nearly twenty of which have been in public health and she is currently based in Workington. She is looking forward to getting to know more of the partners and organizations in Carlisle and working with them to take forward the Healthy Communities Plan.

4. The initial meetings of the group were used to determine its role within Carlisle and the Partnership and to begin to identify need in the City within the context of the group's remit. As a result the following headlines and key areas for activity were identified and included in the community Plan.

Health is poor in some areas of the City but by making small changes people can make a difference.

Carlisle is spearheading the reduction of health inequalities. For example, life expectancy for men in Carlisle is 75.7 years as opposed to 76.6 years for England.

Three key things can make a huge difference:

- **Smoking**: Stopping smoking will benefit health in so many ways and reduces the risks of cancer and heart disease and other illnesses.
- **Being more active**: Trying to build more exercise into daily routines improves heart health and mobility.
- **Diet**: Eating a healthy, varied, low fat and carbohydrate diet, high in fruit and vegetables and drinking less alcohol, significantly improves overall health.

Small changes in any of these start to improve health and life expectancy dramatically.

5. Alongside this work the group provided the necessary inputs to and checks on the development of the Local Area Agreement (LAA) for Cumbria which came into force in

April 2007. The group was particularly concerned to ensure that there was a close match between the needs identified in the Carlisle and those going forward as priorities for Cumbria.

6. In Spring 2007 the Group was fortunate to be in receipt of £100k Communities for Health Funding provided by the Department for Heath via the City Council. This money has enabled the group to commission four projects in pursuit of its priorities.

Communities for Health Initiatives –update on progress

Healthy Communities Network.

A series of events, led by the Council for Voluntary Services (CVS), will focus upon promoting and developing healthier communities in some of the most deprived and isolated areas in Carlisle and will also raise awareness of local health advice and support. At each event, they will provide: A healthy cookery demonstration; Information from local health projects and initiatives; Practical demonstrations on healthy issues as well as offer information packs, free samples and tasters.

Events will (or have) take place in community venues in Longtown, Belah, Raffles, Botcherby, Currock and Brampton between 3 October 2007 and 10 March 2008 and an evaluation report will be prepared in spring 2008.

Two Community Health Network Events will take place (the first was on 28 September at Brunton Park) during the year to March 2008. There will be presentations on local health issues and there will also be a chance for delegates to engage in discussion groups on selected topics.

Smoking Cessation project

This multi-agency training project is now being coordinated by Fiona Huntington, Cumbria PCT and a new schedule of dates for further sessions has been confirmed.

Income maximization for Older People

This project is led by Age Concern and is helping to ensure that older people are receiving their full entitlement to welfare benefits. The HCOP group welcomed the information that in the last two months, more than fifty people had been visited by Age Concern for a benefits check, and a sum of £ 73, 564 in benefits had been secured for these older people.

Community Activity Project

Funding of up to £ 20k has been allocated to the Community Garden Project in Carlisle South.

<u>Cumbria Local Area Agreement – Healthy Communities and Older People theme</u>

7. There is a close relationship (though indirect) between the activity of the Carlisle Healthy Communities and Older People Priority Group of the partnership and the progress on delivery of the targets set out in the Cumbria Agreement (Local Area Agreement). The bi-annual report of the Chair of the group appears to present a useful opportunity to introduce this information to the Committee alongside the Carlisle Partnerships activities.

A breakdown of LAA delivery for quarter 1 of 07/08 is available. The Carlisle Partnership Manager will answer questions on LAA performance in the Healthy Communities and Older People Theme.

LOCAL AREA (CUMBRIA) AGREEMENT 2006-07: PERFORMANCE REPORT FOR QUARTER ENDED 30 JUNE 2007.

1. Recommendations

- 1.1 The CSP executive board is asked to note the exceptions to planned performance contained in the attached report.
- 1.2 The CSP executive is asked to note the learning points from Thematic Partnerships following consideration of 1st quarter LAA performance reports, and consequent actions being taken by TPs.
- 2. Executive Summary
- 2.1 At the time of writing this report, most but not all Thematic Partnerships have met to consider performance information for the quarter ended 30th June. The purpose of this report is to highlight emerging issues from information presented to date to the following TPs:
 - Healthier Communities and Older People.
 - Planning, Transport and Housing.
 - Safer and Stronger Communities.
 - Cumbria Vision (report circulated by e-mail).
 - Waste and Street Scene.

The Children and Young People Strategic Partnership Board and the Environment and Heritage Thematic Partnership have yet to meet and consider quarter1 performance and consequently are not included in this report.

- 2.2 It is acknowledged that information covering only one quarter of LAA performance is available to date and consequently it is much too early to draw conclusions about successful achievement of outcomes in the agreement or the overall impact of the LAA.
- 2.3 Exceptions to planned performance are attached, however Thematic Partnerships are aware of the issues contained in this report and TPs are considering actions to bring performance back on track.
- 2.4 Learning points from quarter 1 focus on overall LAA management issues from the accountable body perspective and will be used to prepare for our 6 month review with Government Office North West in December 2007.

3. Performance & Action Plans

- 3.1 At first glance, there is a high proportion of performance indicators with no information reported at the end of the first quarter and this may be expected. In order to gain an early understanding of potential problems with collecting and reporting performance, Thematic Partnerships are reviewing areas where no information has been reported for quarter one with a view to confirming whether:
 - The information is not collectable quarterly i.e dependent on a 6 monthly or annual event.
 - The information is collectable but has not been gathered and reported yet; but we can expect to see quarterly information in the next report.
- 3.2 In doing so, TPs are asked to highlight in particular, any information problems attaching to stretch targets at an early stage.
- 3.3 Where performance information will not be available until after the year end, TPs have been prompted to confirm that an action plan is in place for delivering on these performance indicators and that the action plan is being monitored throughout the year. As an extension to this exercise, a database of action plans from all TPs is currently being pulled together to supplement hard performance information and it is envisaged that this information will be used to build up a picture of success for the 6 month review with GONW.
- Finally, where under-performance is reported, TPs are being prompted to include a commentary on actions being undertaken to bring performance back on track.
- 4. Pump Priming Grant (PPG), Finance and Stretch Targets.
- 4.1 Where Thematic Partnerships have received PPG to support the achievement of a stretch target and no performance information is included in quarter 1 reports, TPs have been prompted to confirm whether PPG spend is on track and whether slippage in spending grant monies will have an impact on achieving the stretch target. Information for 4 of 12 Stretch Targets is available for quarter 1.






