## To the Chairman and Members of the Licensing & Regulatory Panel on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2002

- Leonardo's is situated at 4-10 Lonsdale Street, Carlisle. It is adjacent to Buskers Nightclub, which is also owned by the same company (Appendix A).
- 2) The Licensee and applicants are: Stephen Crooks, 87 Moorhouse Road, Carlisle Andrew Gardiner, 89 Langrigg Road, Carlisle

They are represented today by their Solicitor Michael Barnes of Cartmell Shepherd who made the application on their behalf (Appendix B).

The premises currently have the benefit of a Public Entertainment Licence with operating times as follows;

Following discussions with one of the applicants, Mr Gardiner, this application may be varied to apply to Friday and Saturday nights only.


- (5) The application has been advertised in a local newspaper and comments invited by 14<sup>th</sup> April 2002.
- (6) Cumbria Constabulary has been consulted and will attend the Panel.
- (7) Planning Services Department have no objections to the application (Appendix D)
- (8) Cumbria Fire Service have no objections to the application (Appendix E)
- (9) Environmental Health have visited the premises and a report is awaited.
- (10) Schedule1 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 is the legislation for the licensing of public entertainment. Section 16 of the Schedule reads as follows;
  - (1) The holder of an entertainment licence may at any time apply to the appropriate authority for such variations of the terms, conditions or restrictions on or subject to which the licence is held as may be specified in the application.

- (2) An authority to whom an application under sub-paragraph (1) above is made may:
  - (a) Make the variations specified in the application.
  - (b) Make such variations as they think fit including the imposition of terms, conditions or restrictions other than those so specified; or
  - (c) Refuse the application.

We act for Stephen Crooks and Andrew Gardiner the licensees of the above premises.

In 1999 our clients obtained a variation to their existing Entertainment Licence to incorporate a dining room on the first floor and in addition to make provision for a new "Nightclub" on the first and second floors.

The Licence granted permitted entertainment in the original premises and the new first floor dining area to 1.00 am and in the new Nightclub to 2.00 am.

For various reasons (not least perhaps the proposed developments in Botchergate) our clients have not progressed the new Nightclub on the first and second floors.
