Formal consultation has been initiated with trade unions and an initial meeting took place on 27 th April 2010 at which issues were tabled. A second meeting is scheduled for 27 th May 2010 and further meetings will be held at monthly intervals thereafter. Old Town Hall The scheme involves upgrade to strategic VIC status and restoration and upgrade of the interior and exterior of the building. The budget for the preferred option is in the region of £1.3m, £540k has been secured, and an application will be made to NWDA and English Heritage for £600k, leaving a shortfall of approx £200k. Project costs have been examined to trim to minimum without affecting integrity of scheme. Concern remains that substantial cuts in content in particular would significantly reduce attractiveness to NWDA/Cumbria Tourism. The application to NWDA has been submitted.
