








Key Facts

CBIC Aims

- A home for the Business School in Carlisle to grow part-time and distance learning provision, CPD and short courses, and engagement with businesses;
- To provide a 'front door' to the University's broader offer of business-facing products and services;
- To provide a focal point for support for student, graduate and community entrepreneurs in the City Centre – recognising the need to stimulate enterprise in the Carlisle district;
- To provide hot-desking and managed space for entrepreneurs and micro-businesses.



CBIC – one year on!



- Officially opened by the Chancellor of the University, the Archbishop of York Dr John Sentamu in November 2013.
- Engaged in a wide range of business and enterprise activity:
 - Received a High Impact Award for Student Enterprise activity (Global Entrepreneurship Week);
 - Quickly filled office rental space and good take up of room hire for training, networking, conference events;
 - Positive social media and editorial coverage with over 50 press articles during the year.



Business School



Current activity

- Teaching to students on a wide variety of business related modules e.g. BSc (Hons) Applied Computing and Masters in Business Administration (MBA);
- Interact with local businesses through student led consultancy projects e.g. research and IT development;
- Supporting KTPs e.g. on-line retailing provision with Carlisle Retail Consortium.

Future activity

- Increase collaborative research and knowledge exchange work and consultancy;
- Develop and deliver short courses for the business community;
- Gain the Small Business Charter through the Association of Business Schools (ABS).



Centre for Regional Economic Development (CRED)



Current activity

- Reports on skills and employment (Cumbria LEP) and inter-firm relationships in the nuclear supply chain (BEC);
- Evaluation of the regional UNITE with Business project positive results for businesses and job creation;
- Facilitated project on 'Work-ready skills' (Inspira);
- New project working with Lancaster University and a CBIC tenant (Incorporate Digital);
- CRED seminar series e.g. Borderlands.

Future activity

- Providing a socio-economic analysis of Carlisle;
- Economic development research and studies.



Business development



Current activity

- SME business support (ERDF UNITE and Growth Hub projects):
 - Graduate placements to SMEs over 50 businesses supported during the last year (including CBIC tenants);
 - Skills Master-classes 170 business leaders attended events e.g. Jo Fairley of Green & Blacks.
- Collaboration with Freerange Industries to deliver activities for the Digital / Creative sector e.g. networking, business breakfasts, Code Cumbria, Young Coders Club;
- A range of business partners hosting training, networking and conference activity e.g. Chamber of Commerce, FSB, CN Group, CCC.

Future activity

LEP funding & other funding for SME support activities.







Student & Graduate Enterprise



Current activity

- 1:1 support for students looking to start a business e.g. Proudman D&C (IT Graduate) now located in CBIC;
- Seminars and workshops in partnership with the Chamber of Commerce, local businesses and national organisations e.g. NCEE;
- Stimulating social enterprise working with UnLtd;
- Referrals for continued support through our partners;
- Art exhibited (C-Art exhibition space with Prism Arts).


Future activity
