With reference to above the following piece of land in Moor Crescent Longtown has been nominated to be transferred from Carlisle City Council to Carlisle housing association.

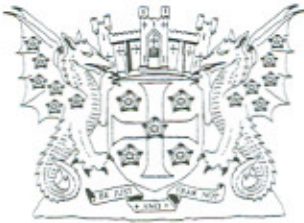
I wish to object to the proposed transfer or sale, of this piece of land to any association, I want it to stay with Carlisle City Council.

Proposed transfer of 'open space' land.

We wish to raise a general objection to the proposed transfer of disused allotment sites to the ownership of Riverside Housing Association. The majority of these sites are landlocked at the moment.
