Summary:-

The Licensing Authority has received an application for the review of a premises licence in accordance with Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Sub-Committee is asked to consider the request in light of the representation that has been made by the District Environmental Health Officer.

It is recommended the Sub-Committee determine the application in accordance with one of the options set out in paragraph 5.

1 THE APPLICATION

The application is for the review of a premises licence under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of premises known as The Globe Tavern, Bank Street, Longtown.

1.1 **Applicant – Environmental Health**

On 21st June 2007 an application was received from Carlisle City Council Environmental Health, a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003, for the review of the premises licence relating to The Globe Tavern, Bank Street, Carlisle **(Appendix 1)**.

The review application relates to the following licensing objective:

 the prevention of Public Nuisance (see para. 1.5 below re additional representations under the objectives from Cumbria Constabulary and Interested Parties)

1.2 Grounds for review

Since the premises licence was transferred to the current licensee, music has been provided on a regular basis. The type and volume of music would appear to be inappropriate for the locality and is proving to be causing disturbance to a number of residents living in the vicinity of the premises.

Despite advice, verbal and written warnings from Environmental Health Officers and the serving of an Abatement Notice, noise from music and customers using the garden is continuing to affect residents enjoyment of their own homes.

- 1.3 Copies of the review application have been forwarded to the Premises Licence Holder and all Responsible Authorities. As a result Cumbria Constabulary have also made representations (Para. 1.5).
- 1.4 The application has been advertised as required by statute for a 28 day period both on the premises, on the Council website and on the Civic Centre main notice board **(Appendix 2)**.
- 1.5 Following the advertising of the review, the following additional representations under the licensing objectives have been received:

2.4 Licence conditions (Carried forward from previous licences)

The conditions under which the licence may operate are included in the premises licence (Appendix 13)

2.5 **Previous complaints**

Following a number of mainly noise related complaints, on 23 May 2007 the premises licence holder, Mr Brown, was requested to attend a meeting at the Civic Centre. Mr Watson of the Licensing Section and Mr Strange of the Food, Health and Safety Team spoke to him. They discussed the complaints and he was given guidance on reducing excessive noise emanating from the premises and the 'Challenge 21' initiative to reduce the risk of underage sales of alcohol. Mr Watson later confirmed the areas discussed in a letter to Mr Brown (Appendix 15).

On 2nd June 2007 Mr Watson visited the area of the Globe Tavern where he met Miss Moir from Environmental Protection. As a result of the level of noise he heard emanating from the premises, Mr Watson prepared a witness statement **(Appendix 16)**.

3 POLICY FRAMEWORK

- 3.1 It is a corporate objective to promote a safe Carlisle. The determination of an application to review a premises licence in accordance with the Act and its statement of licensing policy, fulfils that objective.
- 3.2 Carlisle City Council statement of licensing policy considers reviews of licences at Paragraph 5.2:

5.2.1 The authority will view seriously applications for the review of any premises licence where it involves:

- persistent failure to comply with licence conditions;
- actions or omissions by the licensee (or their staff) which undermine the licensing objectives, particularly where they endanger public safety, expose children to actual or potential harm or cause public nuisance.

5.2.2 They will also view particularly seriously, any applications for review where (inter alia):

- licensed premises have been used for the sale and distribution of illegal drugs and the laundering of the proceeds of drugs crimes;
- there have been proven sales of alcohol to and the consumption of alcohol by children for consumption on or off licensed premises;
- the police have frequently been called to attend to incidents of disorder at the premises;
- there have been frequent sales of alcohol to under age, or persons already intoxicated.
- 3.3 The policy considers the relevant licensing objectives in the following paragraphs: 4.3 Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - 4.4 Public Safety
 - 4.5 Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - 4.6 Protection of Children from Harm

A copy of the policy has been forwarded to Sub Committee members for their information.

3.4 Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states that the Secretary of State must issue guidance to local authorities on the discharge of their functions under this Act. Amended guidance was laid before Parliament on 28 June 2007 and came into force that date.

In relation to the review of premises licences, the guidance refers to the following options available to the authority (Para. 5 of this report).

11.16

The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warning should be issued in writing to the holder of the licence. However, where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.

11.17

Where the licensing authority considers that action under its statutory powers are necessary, it may take any of the following steps:

- To modify the conditions of the premises licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;
- To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption);
- To remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
- To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- To revoke the licence.

11.18

In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than a necessary and proportionate response.

11.19 For example, licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual.

11.20 Equally, it may emerge that poor management is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deeper problems which impact upon the licensing objectives.

11.21

Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a

temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

4 THE LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 The licensing authority must determine the application in accordance with Section 52 of the Act, which outlines the circumstances whereby a hearing is required and the options available to the committee when determining the application.
- 4.2 An appeal may be made to the magistrates' court against the decision of the authority by the responsible authority, interested party or premises licence holder, within 21 days from the date of being notified.
- 4.3 Section 52(11) provides that a determination under this section does not have effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

5 OPTIONS

- 5.1 The application will be determined in accordance with the relevant sections of the Act, the statement of licensing policy and paragraph 11.17 of the section 182 guidance offered by the Secretary of State.
- 5.2 The licensing authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These steps are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence.
- 5.3 Members should also consider para. 11.16 of the guidance (para. 3.4 of this report) where it is considered that no action, or an informal warning should be given.

Since the Premises Licence was transferred to the current licensee, music has been provided on a regular basis. The type and volume of music would appear to be inappropriate for the locality and is proving to be causing disturbance to a number of residents living in the vicinity of the premises.

Despite advice, verbal and written warnings from Environmenntal Health Officers and the service of an Abatement Notice, noise from music and from customers using the garden, is continuing to affect residents enjoyment of their own homes.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

The Globe Tavern is a long established public house situated on Bank Street Longtown, which operated without any complaints being made to this department until 30 April 2007. Since that date, residents have been reporting that music played at the premises is audible within their homes on a regular basis from Thursday to Saturday at night and on Sunday afternoons/evenings.

The Globe Tavern is a stone building with a slated roof, the most recent part of the building was likely to have been constructed around the time of the first world war. The main access door fronts onto Bank Street where older people occupy a number of the residential properties. There are further residential properties in close proximity to the premises on Esk Street, High Street and Netherby Street (see attachment 1). The public house comprises of two bars connected by a corridor. A dancefloor is located in the larger of the two bars where there are a number of windows facing onto Bank Street. The windows have been boarded from the inside with MDF. There is also a fire exit door leading from the bar to a garden area at the rear of the premises.

Transfer of the Premise Licence to the current Licensee took effect from 13 March 2007. It is understood that the licensee has installed a new in house PA system and is now staging regular events which include DJ led dance music (see attachment 2) and theme nights. The garden area which, in the past, was rarely used is now in regular use by customers. Officers have found there is a significant increase in the level of noise escaping from the building when the doors between the bar and the garden are open. Depending on the weather, there can also be significant noise from customers using the garden.

To date, this department is in receipt of 6 complaints from individual residents who reported that noise from the Globe was affecting the enjoyment of their own homes. The majority of complainants stated they did not want to make a formal complaint as they had always got on with previous licensees, however, most felt the noise had become unbearable and felt there was no prospect of anything changing. At least two complainants said they had spoken to the licensee about noise levels. One resident has had to move bedrooms in order to get to sleep, another said she felt frightened when people were hanging around the premises at night. As a result, she went to bed early but then had to pull the duvet over her head and just wait for the noise to stop.

A diary sheet kept by one of the residents is attached (see attachment 3).

Officers from this department have monitored and witnessed the noise from within one of the residential properties affected. Noise from music could clearly be heard within the property with the windows closed. When the property windows were opened, the noise levels increased significantly. When the fire doors at the Globe were open, levels were further increased and included noise from people who were using the garden. As a result of the findings, an EHO considered the noise amounted to a Statutory Nuisance and an Abatement Notice was served on the licensee as the occupier of the premises (see attachments 4a,4&5), however, very little reduction in noise levels would appear to have resulted.

Officers will be able to provide more detailed information on noise measurements at the review hearing.

The following is a diary of events.

30 April 2007 - Initial complaint received regarding noise from music on 28 April. The complainant reported that noise from music played at the premises caused sleep disturbance.

1 May 2007 - Calling card posted through the letterbox at the Globe Tavern.

3 May 2007 – No response from calling card. Letter sent to licensee (see attachment 6).

10 May – 2nd complaint received. Complainant was concerned that regular dance nights were being advertised at the premises

10 May – Informal noise monitoring carried out in the vicinity of the premises. Bass beat and accompanying voice was clearly audible along Bank Street, Esk Bank and part of Netherby Street. The noise was particularly noticeable outside domestic premises opposite the Globe when customers entered and left the Globe.

11 May – The licensee was verbally advised of the previous nights findings and of the consequences should the noise continue and be assessed to be a Statutory Nuisance. The licensee claimed he had not received the letter sent on 3 May

14 May - 3d complaint received.

15 May – A copy of the letter dated 3 May (attachment 6) was hand delivered to the premises. The licensee was invited to a meeting at the Civic centre (see attachment 7)

!8 May - 4th complaint received.

23 May – The licensee was invited to a meeting at the Civic Centre where he was verbally advised of the consequences if the noise continued to cause disturbance.

25 May - 5th complaint received

29 May - 6th complaint received

31 May – Noise monitoring carried out from resident's properties. At the time of the visit, residents commented that although they could still hear the noise, it wasn't anywhere near as bad as it had been earlier in the evening. It was later confirmed that the police had visited the premises earlier in the evening and requested the volume was reduced. The next day, residents reported that the volume increased again around 11.00 PM after officers had left.

2 June – An EHO and Licensing Officer witnessed activities in the vicinity of the public house and from within domestic premises. The officers were able to hear the words of songs and identify tunes being played from within a complainant's house with the windows closed.

5 June - An Abatement Notice (see attachment 4) was served on the licensee.

7 June – Noise was monitored from the street. Bass beat and accompanying voice could be heard but was not as loud as previously witnessed. The next day complainants stated the noise had been audible from their homes but felt that it had reduced.

8 June - An amended Abatement Notice was served (see attachment 5).

9 June – An EHO visited a complainant's property as a result of being called out by the police. The EHO witnessed and measured noise from within a residential property. The noise was considered to be a Statutory Nuisance. Noise levels were witnessed by Police Officers who also attended.

14 June – Further noise monitoring carried out from a residential property. Noise from music was audible from within the property with the windows closed.

15 June - Licensee advised that further action would be pursued (see attachment 8).





On 23 May 2007 you met with my colleagues Mr Watson and Mr Strange. At the meeting you were advised about a number of issues relating to the operation of the above premises which cause concern to this Authority.

My colleague Mr Strange explained this departments position regarding noise nuisance and the consequences of noise being assessed as amounting to a statutory nuisance.

I must advise you that the noise, (in particular, noise from music) emitted from the premises on the 2 June 2007 was excessive and that a statutory nuisance was identified. As such, this Authority must move to the next stage which is the service of an Abatement Notice which formally requires the noise nuisance to cease with immediate and ongoing effect.

The Abatement Notice is enclosed herewith.

Should you wish to appeal the notice, you would need to apply to the Magistrates Court within 21 days from 5 June 2007. Notes relating to appeals are attached to the notice.

Re. Ongoing problems associated with the Globe Tavern, Bank St, Longtown

With regards to the above and our earlier telephone conversation I have the following information to report.

The attached report from Sgt Dent provides a comprehensive overview of incidents at the premises. Contained within the report are details as to how Sgt Dent has tried to work with the licensee, Drew Brown to address some of the concerns raised by local residents. There are also statements from two local officers PCs Hall and Goodwin.

A number of complaints have also been made by local residents to representatives of the Parish Council. These complaints have been passed on directly to me. The majority of the complainants have asked for anonymity as they live in close proximity to the premises.

Between the 1st April and the 24th June 2007 there were 22 reported disorder related issues at the premises. Details of all the incidents are contained within the attached logs which are indexed and attached to the file.

I fully support the comments made by Sgt Dent. The problems at the Globe Tavern are clearly impacting on the quality of life for local residents. Whilst many of the incidents are contained within the premises there is substantial evidence to show that problems are occurring outside the public house that can be directly linked to sale of intoxicants from the Globe. Despite numerous cautions and words of advice the problems relating to the premises are continuing. The licensee seems either unwilling or unable to deal with the incidents that are arising in a competent and professional manner. I also find it extremely worrying to note that despite these problems and the licensees "promises to improve the situation" that he is often absent from the Globe when the premises have been visited.

I do not believe that Mr Brown is a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

I would welcome the opportunity to attend the review of the premises licence for the Globe Tavern. If necessary I will arrange for Sgt Dent and other local officers to be available.

Over the last three months a number of concerns have been brought to my attention with regard to the Globe Tavern PH, Bank St. Longtown, these include,

- 1) Reports of assaults both inside and outside the PH.
- 2) Reports of Criminal Damage again both inside and in the surrounding area.
- 3) Both the sale and use of drugs within the PH.
- 4) Underage drinking within the PH.
- 5) Underage staff serving behind the bar of the PH.
- Reports of the licensee Drew Brown often was not in the PH and left its running to unsuitable persons.

After speaking with the Insp. Coates, I attended the Globe Tavern to speak with Drew Brown on the 29th May 2007 to discuss my concerns he was however not in at the time I went so I arranged to see him later that day. When I did get to see him I pointed out the reports we had had and told him of the number of logs that were on our computer system with regard to the PH. I further told him that even if only some of this was true it was unacceptable and that he was putting his licence at risk if things were not to improve. Mr Brown said he understood my concerns and that he was trying to sort all the problems out. I left him in no doubt that things would be monitored and that I would be returning to see him again, he assured me that he would do his best and told me of a number of things he was doing to improve the situation these included,

- 1) Having door supervisors working on Friday and Saturday nights.
- 2) Making sure all bar staff were suitably trained.
- Having regular DJ's who would keep the noise to acceptable levels and monitoring it himself so if it dose go to high he could get it turned down.
- 4) Having a substance put on the toilet cistern tops to stop the snorting of cocaine.
- Having a total zero tolerance of any drugs in the premises and barring anyone caught with them.

Over the next few days however the police were called to the PH on two occasions because of noise levels. On one occasion Mr Brown was not on the premises to be spoken with but music levels were turned down with the assistance of other staff. I also had several reports from local residents who stated that things had not improved and that offences were still been committed inside the PH. I therefore went to see Mr Brown on the 4th June but again he was not within the PH and I made an appointment to see him on the 5th at 4pm. On the 5th I again attended the PH but was told by staff Mr Brown was not there but was expected back with half an hour, so I left the area but when I returned he was still not there and I was told they now did not know when he would be back. I have since spoken with Mr Brown and told him that things have not improved and that the situation was still being monitored. There have been several further reports about incidents in or just outside the PH. These include complaints of noise, underage staff serving inside the PH, a disturbance outside involving persons who had just come out of the PH and also a serious assault inside the PH where one man sustained a head

injury after being hit over the head with a chair. After this last incident I again attended the Globe and spoke with Mr Brown who appeared to be under the influence of something, speech unclear and slurred, unsteady on his feet, and eyes glazed. At first Mr Brown said nothing had occurred inside the PH but after a member of staff reminded him an incident was recalled but he stated he did not know exactly what had happened. I enquired where the door staff were and he stated that he had none on the only persons I saw working were female bar staff and Mr Brown himself. There were numerous drunken persons on the premises and outside at the time and it took 4 officers over an hour at the scene to conclude the incident.

The problems at the Globe Tavern are causing serious problems for the local community there have been numerous calls of complaint to the police and other organisations. There have been a number of incidents inside and in the environments of the PH including public order, assaults, and criminal damage. All these problems have a big impact on area and the way it is policed. Numerous police working hours have been used to try and sort out the problems but all with little effect on future incidents. As I have said I have met Mr Brown on several occasions and he seems a rather weak person who has little or no control over the PH. In my personal opinion he is not a fit and proper person to hold a licence. A number of other police officers have had occasion to attend the PH and there reports are attached.

Also I was informed that there was persistent underage drinking on the premises ,again which the licensee did not seem to worry about or to take any action against. It is the opinion of these residents that the licensee, 'Drew' is not a fit person to be in charge of a licensed premises due to his attitude to drug abuse and alcohol being consumed by persons who are underage.

I have also been made aware that the licensee, 'Drew' often leaves the licensed premises in the charge of other people on a regular basis and it is not yet known whether these people are both old enough or qualified to do so.

Sir,I have to report that at approximately 0130 hrs on Saturday 7th july 2007 I was on uniformed duty when as a result of a phone call I attended the GLOBE,Longtown in company with PC Hall and PC Sampson.

On arrival I spoke to the landlord DREW BROWN who informed me that despite his asking, persons in the pub were refusing to leave the premises. He immediately struck me as a very timid person but asked him to enter the bar, reiterate his request to leave and we would support him.

This he did and it became immediately apparent that mr BROWN had absolutely no credibility or authority within this establishment and those persons still drinking within the premises completely and utterly ignored him.Mr Brown then made himself scarce with work behind the bar and clearly expected me and my staff to do his job for him. I told Mr BROWN that the process was continuous and had to be repeatedly prompted to show some authority and at least to make his intentions clear by collecting glasses. Mr BROWN remained uninvolved and I decided to clear the pub with my staff without Mr BROWN's assistance. This was a delicate task and took some time as some of the customers were insistant on finishing their drinks.Myself and my staff were subjected to verbal abuse but eventually we cleared the pub via the side door and this was shut behind them.


Imagine my surprise when I turned round to find that the landlord had allowed the same group to re enter via the front door and were sat down again in the bar. This time I made it perfectly clear to the landlord that I thought he was totally incompetent and cleared the pub again ourselves, again with no assistance from the Landlord.

As an officer of 18 years service,7 of those as a sergeant, I have had had occasion to meet several landlords. I will state that on this occasion I met the most incompetent,lazy bystander I have ever had the displeasure of meeting within the licensing trade. I am amazed that he actually holds a relevant licenece,he has no authority and I can clearly see why the customers enjoy total freedom over him.

Recently we have been disturbed on numerous occasions by this public house, since the pub

has been taken over we have had to suffer, lack of sleep from loud base type music,

I am also concerned about the lack of basic hygiene outside the main front doors,

I have to walk my children past the pub every morning on the way to school , we regularly have to

put up with vomit, broken glass, half empty bottles and glasses .

we have lived here for 2 years now and our parents in the same house for 12 years before then,

we have never been bothered by the tavern in all that time, before hand it was just a pub at the end of

the street! its wasn't designed for the levels of music that have been played recently ,although

soundproofing has been installed and we had a visit from the owner asking if we could hear the noise

I write as the current co-owner of 4 Bank St (which has been owned by my family for over 40 years) about the pending action to be taken by various bodies over the manner in which The Tavern is being run

The licensee is operating the Tavern in such a manner as to alter completely the environment of this mainly residential area. The public house has, of course, been there for many many years but the current levels of noise are excessive. They seem to make the house vibrate when the music is playing. The street becomes thronged with youngsters on some evenings and is not unusual to find half empty beer glasses on our windowsill in the morning.

My mother who lived there until her recent death spent her last months complaining to the family about the racket to which she was being subjected.

The present licensee has no regard for the local residents in his efforts to attract custom and make money. Living opposite a village pub is one thing, living opposite the Tavern in its new "trendy, funky hip hop" incarnation is entirely another. It should be ended.





Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

On-licence, no Children's Certificate

No person under 14 years of age shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies;

- (1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence;
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there;
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress;
- (4) The bar is in the railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.



I am employed by Carlisle City Council as a Licensing Officer.

On 23rd May 2007, I attended a meeting at the Civic Centre with Stuart Strange, an officer from Environmental Protection Services. The meeting was arranged following complaints from residents who live near The Globe Tavern, Bank Street, Longtown. The purpose of the meeting was to advise the licence holder of the premises, a Mr Drew Alexander Aitken Brown, about the complaints.

During the meeting, Mr Brown was advised of the consequences if noise from the premises continued to cause a disturbance to residents. He was also advised of allegations of underage drinking alleged to be taking place at the Globe Tavern. The details of this meeting were recorded in writing and a letter was issued to Mr Brown by post (Appendix 13).

On the evening of Saturday, 2nd June 2007, I travelled to Longtown for a prearranged meeting with Margaret Moir, an Environmental Protection Officer, to carry out enforcement duties.

At 2145 hours, I parked in Esk Street approximately 100 metres from the Globe Tavern. The noise of music from the Globe Tavern was immediately



noticeable as soon as my car door was opened.

I then walked down Esk Street onto High Street and stood at the junction of High Street and Bank Street. It was obvious that the music emitted from the Globe Tavern was far too loud for licensed premises in a residential area.

At the front door of the premises, I could see a group of about twelve to fifteen young males and females congregating. Some were drinking from pint glasses and they appeared to be high spirited and loud. At this point I saw four males who would not have passed the 'challenge 21' policy, staggering away from the front door carrying pints of beer. They crossed High Street, still drinking from their glasses.

I returned to Esk Street, where I met Margaret Moir and accompanied her to two separate addresses in Bank Street. The first of these houses was about 60 metres from the Globe Tavern. Inside, we sat in a front room with the window open and the music from the Globe Tavern could be clearly heard. When the window was closed, the noise level dropped but a constant beat of base sounds was persistent and annoying.

We then went visited a house adjacent to the Globe Tavern, where the music from the public house was clearly audible with the windows closed. In the first floor bedroom, the base sounds vibrated through the floor. The noise levels were intolerable and I could clearly identify the words of the songs being played. It is emphasised that the windows in the house were all closed at that time. When the householder opened a window the noise was extreme and the music vibrated throughout the entire house.

From the bedroom window I could see the rear garden of the Globe Tavern and noted that the fire door was wide open. It had been clearly pointed out to Mr Brown at the earlier meeting, that open doors and windows were a major contributing factor, to noise being emitted.

I can state that I have never experienced this extent of noise disturbance. It is my opinion that the quality of life for residents in the Bank Street area of Longtown is greatly diminished by the activities held at the Globe Tavern.

I visited the Globe Tavern on 22nd June 2007, when I placed the 'Notice of Review' in the premises window as well as a lampost in Bank Street.
