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|  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Following the gradual easing of Coronavirus lockdown restrictions in May/June 2020 there has been a significant increase in anti-social behaviour and criminal damage at Hammonds Pond, Carlisle.</li><li>• As landowner, the City Council wishes to proactively assist the work of the Police as much as possible. A key requirement in tackling the ongoing behaviours and incidents in the park is good quality CCTV imagery from a system owned and maintained by the authority.</li><li>• The existing twin camera system is reaching the end of its' serviceable lifespan – the zoom function on one of the cameras has ceased to work and the other camera has failed completely, the Council is therefore unable to support the work of the Police when incidents occur on the site.</li><li>• The Council have investigated various options to improve/renew the cameras as quickly as possible whilst also providing a future-proof system to which further cameras may be added at minimal cost should additional funds become available.</li><li>• Three quotations have been received from reputable suppliers and a preferred option identified, at a total cost of £5082.00. This option will replace both old cameras with new units featuring improved zoom and infra-red for increased clarity at night. The cameras will stream to a new base unit within the café building, which will be linked to a dedicated PC in the Civic Centre via broadband connection.</li><li>• The proposed new system will greatly enhance the CCTV coverage of the areas of the park currently experience high levels of vandalism and anti-social behaviour and allow Council officers to remotely access/view/download footage as required, thereby efficiently assisting the Police in their work to minimise such activity in the park.</li><li>• A full Data Protection Impact Assessment and Operating Procedure for the new cameras will be produced before installation and the equipment will be added to the Surveillance Camera Policy database of locations.</li></ul> |  |  |  |
