Summary:

This report provides a brief update on the potential implications of LSVT and other issues on both Carlisle Works and the Design Division.

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1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND OPTIONS

- 1. The potential implications of LSVT and other issues has generated the need to review both Carlisle Works and the Design Division and this report provides a very brief update.
- 2. At the Council meeting on 11th September 2001 the future direction for Carlisle Works was resolved. Subsequently negotiations have started with Riverside on a range of key issues. The Council has also commissioned HACAS to advise and address corporate issues associated with LSVT and a specialist consultant is working with DSO Management.
- 3. The implications of LSVT and the loss of the Highways Agency have also been reported to Members in February 2001. This situation has been further compounded by recent notification by United Utilities of their intentions regarding the Sewerage Management Contract. Again there are a number of corporate issues which need to be considered and potential options within Design are being embraced in the work being undertaken by HACAS related to the Best Value review of the organisation.

2. CONSULTATION

- 1. Consultation to date. Consultation is taking place with employees and trade unions on an ongoing basis.
- 2. Consultation proposed. Ongoing.
