PROMOTING CARLISLE PORTFOLIO HOLDERS REPORT FOR 12 SEPTEMBER 2006

CARLISLE RENAISSANCE

An update report on Late Night Shopping was presented to Community Overview & Scrutiny Committee at its meeting of 31 August 2006. The City Council in partnership with City Centre businesses has played a pivotal role in helping to establish Late Night Shopping. It is now considered to be selfsustaining without direct additional funding support from the City Council but we will continue to assess how our pattern of service delivery can support Late Night Shopping.

The Accommodation Project Board, established to take forward our review of City Council operational accommodation, has agreed a detailed scope of work and programme and this is available in the City Council's public folders. This work is linked closely to the City Council's Asset Review (the subject of Corporate Resources Overview & Scrutiny Committee workshop on 5 October) and the Shared Services Property Review, initiated through the Cumbria Local Authority Strategic Partnership.

The 2nd phase public consultation on the Development Framework & Movement Strategy commences on 11 September 2006 for a two-week period. Details of the consultation programme are attached.

As part of the Consultation a special supplement will appear in the Cumberland News on Friday 08 September 2006. Arrangements are being made to make an advance copy available for all Members which will be sent out separately.

All the constituent priority groups have now met at least twice and each has authorised Roles and Responsibilities or Terms of Reference.

Ned Kemp has been appointed LSP Manager and is the main Officer contact at the City Council.

Cross-cutting issues:

The Convenors Group has the responsibility for identification and monitoring of progress on the cross-cutting issues of Rural proofing, the Environment, Carlisle Renaissance, Learning City and Cleaner, Greener, Safer Carlisle and incorporating targets for each of these themes into the Community Plan. A methodology for checking all LSP activity against Rural, Equality & Diversity, Environmental sustainability, relevance and impact will be adopted building on the experience of the CSP process of "Rural Proofing" and Environmental sustainability.

A refreshed Sustainable Community Strategy for Carlisle (Community Plan).

A timetable has been established which will result in an initial draft at the end of September for consideration by the LSP Executive before going out to consultation. The Council's Overview and Scrutiny committees will be involved in this process. The intention is to achieve final approval in December and publication in early 2007.

CUMBRIA IN BLOOM

Cumbria in Bloom judges visited Carlisle on Thursday 27 July to assess Carlisle's floral flair. They inspected city centre streets including Warwick Road, The Crescent, Shaddongate, Dalston Road, Richardson Street and Wigton Road.

They also visited the Citadel Railway Station, Tullie House Museum Gardens, Carlisle Cemetery and Chances Park.

Stanwix in Bloom was also judged on the same day.

The Cumbria on Bloom winners will be announced on Monday 04 September 2006.

GREEN FLAG AWARD

Bitts Park was awarded a Green Flag Award. The Park was one of 423 green spaces across England and Wales to achieve this national standard.

POP2THEPARK

Nearly 4,000 people attended this year's pop2thepark event, despite damp conditions on the day.

The Bitts Park open air concert included a packed programme of top-class acts including the Sugababes, G4, Son of Dork and Frank, from Channel 4's Totally Frank fame. Local soap superstar, Roxanne Pallet also made her live pop debut.

The main bands were supported by seven up and coming bands as well as Carlisle based band, Giant Loop of Sound.

Funded and organised by Carlisle City Council, the event was in partnership with the News & Star, CFM, Carlisle Leisure Limited and sponsored by Cumbria County Council, Stobarts and Kingmoor Park.

SHEEPMOUNT STADIUM OFFICIAL OPENING

HRH Prince Edward, The Earl of Wessex, will officially open The Sheepmount Stadium on Friday 29 September. The opening will include VIP guests and representatives from Sport England, UK Athletics and the Football Foundation. Local children will be taking part in football and athletic activities.

CARLISLE GREAT FOOD FAIR

Carlisle hosted the region's largest Food Fair over the August Bank Holiday weekend.

There was the return of the popular Continental Market and also Made in Cumbria sellers. More than 30 stalls were set up in the city centre, ranging from charcuterie specialist meats from Corsica to French patisseries.

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The City Council has taken ten pledges to improve the council's ecoperformance. We have signed an Environment Policy Statement which pledges the Council to take responsibility for managing the environmental impact of the Council's activities and will aim to continually improve 'in-house' performance.

CARLISLE FOCUS

The Autumn edition is available and this edition carries the annual readers' survey.

Last year, 89% of respondents said Carlisle Focus was their preferred method of receiving information from the Council, 80% found it interesting, 61% easy to read, 58% informative and 45% useful.

CARLISLE FIRESHOW

Cowboys, saloons and sheriffs will be centre stage at this year's Carlisle City Council Fireshow. More than 35,000 people attend the sparkling spectacular each year, which this year will follow a Wild West theme. The free event will be held on Saturday 4 November in Bitts Park at 7pm.

CHRISTMAS

The Christmas Lights Switch-on this year will be on Sunday 19 November. This year there will be a Christmas Market in the City Centre from 06 – 10 December. This builds on the successful Continental Markets, which are held during the year. The Christmas Grotto will again be held in the Assembly Room of the Old Town Hall.

There will be a Carol Parade on Thursday 14 December taking advantage of a late night shopping evening.
