1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND OPTIONS

- At it's last meeting, the Executive received a presentation from a group from Trinity School on their proposal to host this year's European Youth Parliament from 13th – 21st July
- 2. Around 130 students from 12 European Nations will attend including 20 from Carlisle.
- 3. The total cost of hosting the Parliament for one week will be in the region of

- £55,000 of which, approximately £25,000 has already been secured.
- 4. The organising group has approached the City Council for assistance and it is suggested this could be offered in the following ways
 - a) Cash grant £1,000 *
 - b) The Mayor to host a Civic Reception, with dinner included £1,500 *
 - c) Dinner at Tullie House £700 *

Direct Cost to Council £3,200*

- d) 2 x Swimming Sessions at the Pools £600
- e) Use of Council Chamber for Meeting (with refreshments) £220
- f) Visit to Tullie House £270
- g) Visit to Brampton Live on Friday 19th July £1,800

Free use of Facilities £2,890

- 5. Our total contribution would therefore be worth £6,090
- 6. Those suggestions marked * totalling £3,200 will require funding, but the remainder can be offered 'in kind' with no direct cost to the Council.

The £1,000 cash grant can be funded from the Grants for Leisure Budget and has been agreed by Councillor Mrs Pattinson as an Individual Portfolio Holder's Decision.

The balance of £2,200 for the Civic Reception and the dinner at Tullie House could be funded by exercising virement from the Town Twinning Budget.
