Tullie House

Tullie House Museum and Art Gallery Trust has been successful in its application for the Arts Council's Major Grants Fund. This is a three year funding arrangement.

A great deal of credit to the Tullie House team, who despite been told that Tullie would not qualify for the new funding, were not put off. We led a consortium of other Cumbria museums, which together met the criteria. Tullie House was the lead museum, the consortium also included the Lakeland Arts Trust and the Wordsworth Trust.

Senior Officers' Pay

A statement on the pay and remuneration of Senior Officers has been produced to meet the requirements of the Localism Act and is due to be presented at Council on 6 March. The Statement has also resulted in minor amendments HR policies which form part of the Statement (updating terminology and removing interim arrangements that are no longer valid).

Agency Workers Directive

Personnel have worked with the Procurement Team to rationalise use of agency staff through a corporate process. This will simplify
